What is the International Baccalaureate?

The International Baccalaureate (IB) is a high school program that doubles as a highly respected college prep curriculum.

The IB program encourages students to think broadly, beyond the boundaries of their communities, and to see themselves as members of a global society. It has gained recognition and respect from most U.S. colleges.

Learning Globally

The IB Diploma Program is an intense curriculum for high school juniors and seniors which helps develop the intellectual, personal, emotional and social skills to live, learn and work in a rapidly globalizing world. It culminates in six rigorous subject exams.

The program was originally a standard curriculum for children of people moving from one country to another (such as diplomats or the military). Today there are over a million IB students in nearly 150 countries.

The IB Curriculum

The IB has six main areas of study: language and literature, foreign language acquisition, individuals and societies, experimental sciences, mathematics and the arts. Three additional elements round out the program: a theory of knowledge course, learning outside the classroom (Creativity, Action and Service), and a 4,000-word essay.

College Credit for IB

Many colleges and universities offer credit or placement to students with high scores on IB exams. Students typically must attain at least a score of 5 out of 7 points on an exam for a higher-level course to be eligible for college credit. Some colleges offer up to one year of credit for successful completion of the IB Diploma. Most colleges recognize the academic strength of the IB program, but each college has its own policies about granting credit for IB exams.

The Baccalaureate School for Global Education (BSGE)

The International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) was founded in Geneva, Switzerland, in 1968. Its original purpose was to facilitate the international mobility of students preparing for university by providing a curriculum and diploma recognized by universities around the world. Since then, the IBO has expanded and seeks to make an IB education available to students of all ages. The IB programs allow graduates to fulfill the requirements of national education systems worldwide, incorporating the best elements of each.

Founded in September 2002, and located in Astoria, the Baccalaureate School for Global Education (BSGE) provides a world-class educational experience aligned with the frameworks and standards of the IB Program.

In April 2005, BSGE was authorized by the IBO as a Diploma Program (DP).

Pre-IB Program, Grades 7 & 8

The Pre-IB Program prepares students for both the Diploma Program and the New York State Regents Exams. Eight subject groups form the curricular framework:

- Language A English
- Language B Mandarin
- Mathematics Pre-Algebra, Algebra
- Sciences General Science, Living Environment
- Humanities American History, Global Studies and Geography
- Technology
- The Arts Music, Visual Arts
- Physical Education Health and Hygiene, Individual and Team Sports

- Language B Spanish or French (9th Grade Year 1, 10th Grade Year 2)

Díploma Program (DP), Grades 11 and 12

The IB Diploma Program is a rigorous course of study leading to external examinations in six core academic groups:

- IB English Literature (Language A)
- IB French or Spanish (Language B)
- IB Mathematics Standard Level or IB Math Studies Standard Level
- IB Biology or IB Chemistry Standard Level
- IB History of the Americas Higher Level (Individuals and Societies/Government and Economics)

IB Program continued

- Group 6: IB Computer Science Higher Level or IB Visual Arts Higher Level
- Physical Education

Full Diploma candidates must also satisfy three special features included in the program in order to earn the IB Diploma:

- Theory of Knowledge course challenges students to question the basis of knowledge, to be aware of ideological biases, and to develop modes of thought based on analysis of evidence and rational argument. At the end of the course, students prepare a formal paper and an individual presentation.
- Creativity, Action and Service (CAS) IB Diploma candidates are required to perform and document 150 hours of creativity, action and service activities during grades 11 and 12. These activities encourage students to share their energies and talents outside of the classroom.
- Extended Essay a required essay of at least 4,000 words offers students the opportunity to investigate a topic of special interest and prepares them for independent research and writing expected at the university level.
