Teaching Tips: Make a shutter fold. To do this, pinch the paper in the middle where a hamburger crease would be. Then use the pinch as a guide to bring both sides to the middle, making a shutter. Glue the 3 statements about the VA Statute of Religious Freedom to the inside the shutter. Glue the document on top, slicing it in the middle after gluing to allow the shutter to open.
