## STATE COMPETITION

NYSPHSAA has cancelled all State Spring Sport Championships for the 2021 season.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

**26. Representation Rule:** NYSPHSAA Approved Waiver - from 6 to 4 (5/5/2021)

**Minimum Number of Contests** To be eligible for sectional, intersectional or state competition, a team must have completed in *four (4)* school scheduled contests which occurred on *four (4)* different dates during the season.

**Team Sports:** An individual is eligible for the team if he/she has been an eligible participant on a team in that sport in that school for a minimum of **four (4)** scheduled contests during the regular season.

## **General Considerations:**

- Only the scorekeeper shall touch/handle the scoresheet.
- Disinfect the bench prior to competition.
- Suspend handshakes, fist bumps and similar gestures prior to and following the pregame conference in addition to at the conclusion of the game.



 A socially distanced pre-game conference with referees and one captain from each team will be conducted.

## **COVID GUIDELINES (cont.)**

- Limit seats at the scorer's table to essential personnel which may include home team scorer, visitor team scorer, penalty timer and clock operator with a recommended distance of 6 feet or greater between individuals. Other personnel (statisticians, media, etc.) may not be deemed essential personnel and an alternate location should be considered for them.
- Individuals in bench and penalty box areas must adhere to social distancing as much as possible.
- Clear, molded, and non-rigid face shields approved by the helmet manufacturer are permitted however these shields do not meet the NYSDOH rule of wearing a cloth face covering.

#### 2020-2021 RULES CHANGES

Due to the cancellation of spring sports last year because of the Coronavirus, the 2020 NFHS Boys Lacrosse Rules will be used for the 2021 season. The Rules Changes written last year will apply for the 2021 season. These changes, which all reference the 2020 NFHS Boys Lacrosse Rules Book, will be in effect for the 2021 season. Boys Lacrosse Rules Changes

#### **BOYS LACROSSE STANDARDS**

- 1. All games shall be played under National Federation Lacrosse Rules with only changes being those adopted by the NYS Lacrosse Rules Committee.
- 2. Home team at games is responsible for providing approved NFHS/NOCSAE Lacrosse Balls. If the home team does not have the balls then the referee will give a short time to get them and/or ask the visiting team if they have proper lacrosse balls. If the visiting team does have the proper ball then the game can start but there will be no face off. Ball is given to the visiting team at the midline and there will be no face-off at the beginning of the game. If the visiting team does not have the lacrosse balls for the game, the game will be postponed until which time the approved lacrosse balls are present.
- 3. CROWD CONTROL and SUPERVISION of SPECTATORS is the responsibility of each school. COACHES are STRONGLY URGED to have SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION PRESENT with spectators at their respective games.
- 4. The HOME TEAM should provide a table and chairs for the scorers and timekeepers.
- 5. It is recommended that the HOME TEAM provide an adult as an official timer.
- 6. Ball retrievers at the end and/or sidelines must wear a lacrosse certified helmet.
- 7. Interrupted Game: The procedure for rain delay or interrupted contest will be administered in accordance with NFHS Lacrosse Rules; Rule 3 Section 5, p.27. Any suspended game or interrupted contest will begin at the time of discontinuation unless a variation of the rule have been agreed by both schools.
  - The suspended game shall be resumed from the point of interruption at the next available mutually agreed upon date.
  - Both teams are permitted to make roster changes.
  - By mutual agreement of the opposing coaches and approval of the referee, any period may be shortened or game terminated.

**All games to date must be entered in ScoreBoard** no later than Tuesday, June 1st. Any games played on June 1st or 2nd need to be texted/called/emailed to Joe Ceglia as well as entered into ScoreBoard no later than 7pm.



## SECTION ONE TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE DECISIONS

- 1. Seeding of all teams accepted for tournament play.
- 2. The contest site(s), contest dates and starting times are determined by the Tournament Committee. Changes due to inclement weather will be made by the Coordinator and/or Tournament Committee. These changes are considered binding on all schools applying to and participating in the Tournament.
- 3. The Tournament Seeding Committee has final authority as to who will be accepted in either the Class
- A, Class B, Class C or Class D Tournament in the best interests of Section One Boys Lacrosse.
- 4. The tournament Seeding Committee reserves the right to rescind bids, alter schedules, sites or playing times due to circumstances that are deemed unacceptable to the best interest of Section One Boys Lacrosse and its member schools.

## **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATION/FORM INFORMATION**

- 1. All schools and participants representing their schools must follow the eligibility requirements as stated in the NYSPHSAA Handbook.
- 2. All entrants in the Section One 2021 Boys Lacrosse Tournaments must have the ScoreBoard submitted no later than Tuesday, June 1, 2021.
