Upson-Lee Middle School will:

1. Provide high quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables students to meet the state's student academic standards by:

- Ensuring instructional framework (opening, work, closing) is implemented consistently and effectively.
- Increasing the use of technology to enhance differentiation, flexible grouping, and assistive technology. There will be a Chromebook for every student in every class.
- Delivering planned instruction based on the Georgia Standards of Excellence and student data which guide instruction, curriculum, and assessment.
- Increasing rigor and relevance for all students.
- Implementing more literacy and writing across all content areas. Using strategies from researched programs such as Comprehensive Reading Solutions and RACE.
- Offering workshops, content nights, and informational meetings to parents on strategies for them to use at home to promote literacy improvement.

2. Hold parent teacher conferences where this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual's child achievement.

- Parents will choose a convenient time via response to letters sent home in the fall.
- A specified date and time will be sent out in January for a school wide conference.
