Early Admission to Kindergarten or First Grade

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Thank you for your interest in early admission to kindergarten for your student. **Steger School District** 194 follows Illinois School Code, which specifies that to enter kindergarten children must be five years of age by September 1 of their kindergarten year.

Exceptions to this policy may be made for children whose potential and skills are in the very superior range. District 194 has specific criteria and procedures for considering parent requests for early entrance. The decision for a child to enter school early can have a profound effect on his or her academic and social performance for the remainder of the child's school career. It is a decision that needs to be taken very seriously.

The criteria for early admission established by District 194 are very rigorous. The goal is to ensure that children are not frustrated by the challenges of the instructional programs and any negative effect that early placement might have.

Criteria:

- Proof of residency according to current district policies
- Kindergarten: The child's fifth birthday falls between September 2, 2020 and November 9, 2020, as documented by a certified copy of the birth certificate.
- First Grade: The child's sixth birthday falls between September 2, 2020 and November 9, 2020, as documented by a certified copy of the birth certificate.
- The child demonstrates attention, gross and fine motor skills, cooperative play, social and emotional skills, and expressive and receptive language skills in the superior range.
- The child attains required minimum scores on an intelligence test, and on assessments administered by District 194. The procedures for early admission established by District 194 are very specific, and must be adhered to by all parents requesting early admission.

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Requesting Early Admission to Kindergarten or First Grade: Procedures

Step 1. Letter of Request: First year of implementation 2020-2021: To begin the process, parents must submit a letter to Steger School District 194 Administrative Center, Attn: Ms. Jan Lenci, on or before August 13, 2020 indicating the reasons why early admission to kindergarten or 1st grade is being requested. Completion of Parent Request Form and Parent Survey Form: The parents must also complete and submit the Parent Request Form and a Parent Interview Form with the letter of request described above on or before August 13, 2020. It is important that the person who completes these forms is the person that the child lives with. *All subsequent years beginning with 2020-21 school year: submission of ALL documents listed above must be completed/submitted on or before April 1st for the upcoming school year.

Step 2: Review of Request: If all paperwork is completed/submitted by the deadline, the district team will review all documents and determine whether the DAS for early admission is warranted.

Step 3: DAS: If the team determines that the DAS is warranted, it will be scheduled and will be given at Steger Primary Center, 3341 Miller Ave., South Chicago Heights, IL 60411. Testing time is approximately 60 minutes; results from the DAS will be analyzed by the district team.

Step 4: Assessment: A student scoring 120 or higher on the DAS will be scheduled for a student interview and the KTEA Assessment. A certified school Psychologist and school Social Worker will oversee the interview and will give the required assessment. These will take place at Steger Primary Center, 3341 Miller Ave., South Chicago Heights, IL 60411. Testing time is approximately 2 hours; results from the KTEA assessment/interview will be analyzed by the district team.

Step 5. Final Determination: After the necessary data has been analyzed, the decision whether or not to approve early admission will be made by the district team. If the request is approved, the principal will inform the parents by letter, indicating how to proceed to enroll their child for the 2020-21 school year. If the request is not approved, the principal will inform the parents by letter to explain the reasons why their child is not eligible for early admission. A parent reserves the right to dispute the decision and to file an appeal with the Superintendent.

Children who are approved for early admission will be enrolled on a probationary basis. The school staff will assess the child's initial adjustment to school during the 20 school days. If it is determined that the child's adjustment is satisfactory, the child may continue enrollment.

If a child's adjustment is not satisfactory, the district team will notify the parents. At this time, the child will be withdrawn, and the district will follow **Illinois School Code regarding enrollment into Kindergarten or 1st Grade**.
