What's New At Lincoln

Lincoln Somebodies: We have a saying, "At Lincoln, Everybody has a Somebody." To ensure that this is really true, we have created a new position called (drumroll, please...) "Lincoln Somebodies." There are 5 Lincoln Sombodies assigned to the 9th grade cohort, and 2 Lincoln Somebodies assigned to the 10th grade cohort. Lincoln Somebodies connect with students to be sure that all students feel valued and understood by at least one adult.

College & Career Coordinators: This is another position we have created to have more effective outreach to our 9th and 10th graders. The College Coordinators will be arranging an ongoing rotation of meetings between students and teachers to specifically discuss college and career preparation. If these discussions wait until the 11th grade, many students only find out later about things they should have been doing in the 9th & 10th grade. We want our students to enjoy their time at Lincoln AND prepare for the future.

Social Worker in the Deans Office: This summer, we hired a social worker, Ms. Ketsie Robert, to work exclusively in our Deans Office. Many lower level incidents can be prevented if students are equipped with more effective social/emotional competencies. In addition, 40% of our disciplinary incidents come from repeat offenders. These students need supports, such as work on anger management and other coping strategies. Now they will receive these supports immediately in the Deans office.

In addition to the 3 new initiatives above, we are determined to approach the challenges of this year with fresh eyes and a fresh heart.

In meditation, one is reminded to approach each meditation with a "beginners mind" – pretend you have never done this before, approach it with a fresh attitude.

It is this freshness, this "beginners mind," that makes young children, kittens, and and puppies so appealing.

We want to face this school year with the same freshness and curiosity. All of have been traumatized to some degree by the challenges of the past 18 months, and we must address these challenges with a fresh and open mind. As our namesake, Abraham Lincoln, said in 1862: "The occasion is piled high with difficulty, and we must rise with the occasion. As our case is new, so we must think anew, and act anew."

We will have a great year.
