Please drop your child off at the all-purpose room lobby entrance along the side of the building no earlier than 7:00 PM. Students need to be picked up promptly at 9:00 in front of the building via main door. We ask for parents to remain in their car in the regular car line. Parents are encouraged to make carpool arrangements. Students will be dismissed one at a time or in small pre-arranged groups to adults that are listed as emergency contacts in the Realtime parent portal. Please be certain to update the emergency contacts listed on your child's parent portal, to include those who will be picking your child up. **These are adults that you give permission to pick up and transport your child safely home. Under no circumstances will any student be permitted to walk/bike home from a school dance.**

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Why do we register in November for a "spring" sport?

The league we play in - South Jersey Youth Lacrosse - requires us to submit the number of teams we will have in each division as well as the flight levels of the older groups, by the first week of February. We have to hold our registrations this early so we can determine how many teams we will have at each age group, so we can schedule pre-season indoor clinics in January and so we can get players sized and order their uniforms in time.

Will players from Nokomis & Neeta play on the same team?

We like to keep players at the U6, U8 and U10 level with friends or classmates whenever possible. The higher level U12 and U14 teams are formed after player evaluations to give each player an opportunity to develop her lacrosse skills in a challenging environment with players of comparable skill level.

Is this a travel or rec program?

MYAA Girls Lacrosse is a TRAVEL program. However, unlike other travel programs (i.e., soccer and basketball) there are NO CUTS. Any girl, who wants to play, will play in our program.

Our teams play in the South Jersey Youth Lacrosse League. This league has 22+ local programs participating from Avalon to Moorestown and from Northern Burlington to Woodstown.

When are games and practices?

Practices typically begin in early March, weather permitting, most coaches hold practices twice a week based upon their schedules. Games for U6 and U8 are usually on Saturday afternoon with U10, U12 and U14 playing on Sunday afternoons. Our season starts during the last week of March and runs for 8 weeks. There are no games Easter weekend, but we do play on Mother's Day.

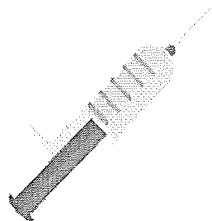


Burlington County Health Department Flu Shot Thursdays
