Description:

ENL (English as a New Language) introduces students to basic and intermediate structures and vocabulary of the English Language through the skills of reading, writing, listening and speaking to function proficiently in social situations as well as learn challenging academic content through the curriculum.

Curriculum:

Students will learn strategies in order to advance their reading, listening, writing, and speaking skills. They will expand oral comprehensibility and write complete sentences, a standard paragraph, and short content-based essays. The lessons will be tailored to best suit the diverse needs with the English Language Learner population.
