





Recent Guidance Regarding Planning for In-Person Learning

- Putnam County DOH released guidance on 3/4/21- "the development of those plans remain the sole responsibility of the school district"
- "Putnam County recommends mitigation efforts."
- NYS "permits districts to reduce distance between individuals through the use of partitions and barriers".
- Putnam County DOH "continues to recommend 6 ft distance between individuals when possible".
- Face Shields- Can mitigate the transfer when worn over masks
- Rarely spreads on surfaces-CDC
- Increasing Ventilation helps against transmission PCDOH
- Quarantine increase will occur with more in classes and spaces



Guidance Regarding Planning for In-Person Learning

- July 2020 original memo from NYS DOH-
- "Appropriate social distancing means six feet of space in all directions between individuals or use of appropriate physical barriers between individuals that do not adversely effect air flow, heating, cooling, or ventilation, or otherwise prevent a health or safety risk."









March 4, 2021 memo from PCDOH:

County test positivity rate below 5% and total new cases remain in low/moderate transmission zones and hospitalization rates remain stable or decline schools should continue efforts to bring more students in.
