Dear District 161 Parents and Guardians,

District 161 students will take the annual Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) and Illinois Science Assessment (ISA) assessments during March and April. Students in grades three through eight will take the PARCC assessment in Math and English Language Arts (ELA). Fifth and eighth grade students will also take the ISA. The PARCC assessment is a computer based, Common Core aligned assessment and will provide information on students' progress towards meeting grade-level expectations as defined by the Common Core Standards. The District 161 testing window for PARCC is April 3 - 20, 2018 and the ISA testing window is March 5 - 23, 2018. Each District 161 school will share schedules with families.
