Only buses may access the high school from Meadow Street.

Parents who are dropping off students must do so via the Constitution Boulevard North entrance. Upon entering the SHS campus, the two-lane line of traffic follows from Constitution Boulevard North toward Meadow Street. Students, who are to be dropped off, must be in the right-hand lane and must be dropped off only where the security guard is stationed near the bus loop. Parents must then exit the school by making a right hand turn on Meadow Street.

Students are not allowed to be dropped off at the main entrance due to the heavy flow of students and staff exiting their vehicles and proceeding to the main entrance. No vehicle traffic will be allowed to exit to Constitution Boulevard in the morning.

The gates on Constitution Boulevard North are closed during school hours.
