

Alternate Electives

An "alternate" is a "just in case" class.

 The semester classes that students do not choose automatically become the alternate electives.

For example, if I choose Band, Art, and World Language as my top choices then Music Technology/Piano Lab and Computer Technology become my alternate electives.

- 3. Advanced College Academy (Social Sciences, Associate's Degree from J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College)
- 4. Code RVA (Computer Science, Associate's Degree from J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College)

Students can apply to these programs during Fall of 8th grade year. There are Fall information sessions. Must be in Algebra 1 in 8th grade for all but CodeRVA.
