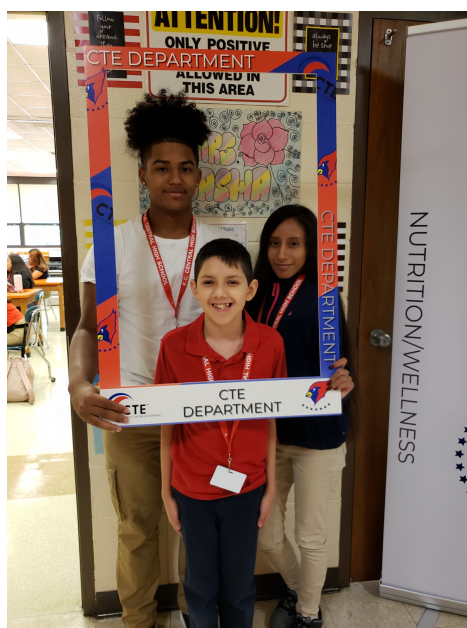

PATHWAY SPOTLIGHT: CULINARY ARTS

Nutrition and Wellness is a one-semester course for 9th-12th grade students. In this course students learn about kitchen safety, the food supply, nutrition, careers, and food preparation. Students have hands on experiences in the kitchens through various labs. Many of our Nutrition and Wellness students move on to take Culinary Arts and Advanced Culinary Arts which are the next classes in the pathway. Both Culinary Arts and Advanced Culinary Arts are year long courses for 11th-12th graders. Advanced Culinary Arts is also offered as a dual-credit course through Ivy Tech which allows students to earn up to 6 credits. Students build on knowledge and skills learned about in Nutrition and Wellness and have extensive hands-on food preparation experiences.
