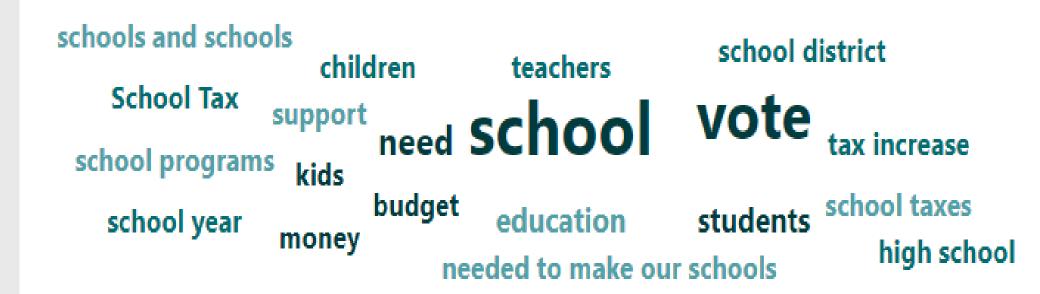


# Carmel Central School District Transportation Purchase/Lease Vote Options

- Prior years, purchase program always represented in the budget with no separate proposition vote
  - 2021-2022 bus purchase eliminated due to contingency budget
  - Previous years bus purchases reduced in order to stay within the cap
- Are there advantages to creating a separate referendum for bus purchase/lease program?
  - Questions of transparency may potentially arise
    - seemingly not being part of the whole budget process
  - Would allow the District to spread payments over a 5-year period *but* will add interest expenses as well as legal costs of issuing the finance (BAN)
- Current purchase/lease program is represented in the budget to be presented as one vote with budget
  - Transparency
  - NYSED recommended approach for promotion of full disclosure
  - CCSD Administration recommended approach

# Carmel Central School District Contingency Budget

#### What is a contingency budget and why would we need one?

- If the budget vote fails twice, the District must adopt a contingency budget which has many requirements including:
  - No increase to the prior year's tax levy
  - Expenditure budget cannot increase by more than 120% of CPI
  - No purchases of buses or equipment
  - Capital Outlay project are not permitted
  - Administrative Component of Budget is limited to prior year's % of total budget
  - To the extent aid is specifically designated for the purchase of equipment (computer hardware), such equipment can be considered an ordinary contingent expense.
  - No use of school facilities by outside groups (unless costs are reimbursed)
  - Taylor law must apply to consider ordinary contingent expense
  - Certain field trips are eliminated (unless fully reimbursed)



# Carmel Central School District Contingency Budget

#### What does a contingency budget mean for the CCSD?

- Tax levy at 0%
  - Necessary reductions = \$3,027,524
- Equipment purchase remains at \$0 for second year
- Capital outlay remains at \$0 for second year
- Small bus *purchase* removed from the budget
  - 4 small busses and 2 suburban's = \$352,000
- Large bus *lease* can remain as an ordinary contingency purchase
  - 16 large busses = \$384,000 each year for 5 years
- No field trips for second year must be fully funded
