

## Federal Funding at SLHS

Though not a Title I school, Title I, Title II, Title III, and Title VII funding of the NCLB act is available at SLHS. This brochure is to help inform you of the federal dollars at work here for children at our school.

Federal programs are coordinated by supervisors at the Lockport Media Center. The following federally funded programs or services at SLHS are as follows:

- Homeless-McKinney Vento Act-Title I-Part A funds are used and coordinated through our counseling center for homeless student needs such as school supplies and uniforms, academic assistance, and other family support services. Professional School Counselor, Bonnie Lefort is the School contact person. Please speak to our professional school counselors for services.
- Title I Part D- Neglected and Delinquent programs will be newly funded by transitioning students between school and the juvenile justice facility. Contact the media center for more information.

## Federal Dollars Working for You!!

- Migrant Education—Title I Part C funds academic intervention for migrant students. These programs will service students with a 50/50 focus on academics and advocacy. Migrant students are assisted with tutoring and interventions to support student success. Tammie Arcement is the coordinator.
- ELL (English Language Learners)- Title III funds teachers to work with student that have limited English language skills. Furthermore, a new focus will be to fund professional development for classroom teachers teaching ELL students. Tammie Arcement is the new Migrant and ELL Coordinator.



- Indiana Education Program Title VII funds services for Indian students through academic and enrichment programs. Charlene Guidry is the coordinator. An increase in cultural activities and quarterly monitoring will be a focus this school year.
- Title II Title II funds curriculum specialist who
  provide support and assistance to teachers.
  Some sites have Class Size Reduction teachers to reduce the pupil/teacher ration for at
  risk student in a classroom, Staff development
  activities, funding to assist teachers to become highly qualified, and materials for staff
  development can be used with Title II funding.
  Lastly administrators can use Title II funds to
  assist with leadership training.
