Portfolio Development for High School Artists (ages 13-18)

Create or expand your art portfolio and express your creative ideas! Experiment with a variety of media, develop your own style and create new works to make your portfolio more competitive! Whether you are expanding your portfolio or exploring new techniques of drawing and painting, join us for this fun class! Individual guidance will be given to expand your portfolio. If you have a list of recommended works from an art school that you are applying to, please bring to class. Discussions about the many forms of creative expression and references to famous artists' works. Various materials for drawing and painting are provided and feel free to bring your sketchbook and materials as well.

NEW! Fashion Illustration (ages 12-15)

Working with their own sense of color, texture and imagination, students will have the opportunity to illustrate designs representing their own unique style. NEW! Exploring Architecture (ages 9-12)

This hands-on class is a fun way to discover geometry and it's strengths using different materials. In this exciting mixed media workshop, children will create and construct models, using different (sometimes unusual) materials. Each class will build on the next, covering aspects including looking at architecture throughout the world, strength testing models, creating origami, building domes, bridges and towers using different and unusual materials. The workshop will culminate with students working in groups to produce a model of their choice and a short presentation of their creations.

Teen Wheel Throwing (ages 13-17)

Claymation (ages 8-11)

Claymation, or clay animation, is a type of stop-motion animation that uses frame-by-frame images to capture the motion of clay figures. In this exciting mixed media studio workshop, children will write the story, create and construct characters, design sets and photograph scenes. Components covered include writing the story, creating characters, fashioning dialogue, designing sets, creating lighting and sound effects, and photographing scenes. The workshop will culminate with students working in groups to produce a short claymation film.

Little Artists Exploring Artists (ages 3-5)

Each week we will explore the style and technique of a different artist! We will begin with a short presentation about the artist's life and pictures of his/her work. The most important aspects of the art projects are discovery, exploration and individual creativity. However, ther are exposed to a little art history. Perhaps they will be inspired to read books, visit a museum, or go to the library for more information.
