Dear Parents/Guardians:

I hope you all had a great MLK holiday weekend! Beginning this week, we are asking for your assistance with dismissal. We tell all students to go straight home every day and instead they are gathering outside to fight, record fights or instigate situations. There have been many incidents outside of the school and around the surrounding area. These incidents have led to injury and police involvement. Please, tell your children to go straight home after school and avoid any incidents that are happening outside.

This week we are administering the 2nd round of MAP Mathematics Periodic Assessment. Any student who was not present will receive a make-up session this week.

On January 21st, marking period 2 ends. All students must submit final assignments in order to receive credit for marking period 2. Promotion in doubt letters will be given out the first two weeks of February. I urge you to please make sure your child has submitted all assignments. Our school will use multiple measures of performance to assess student progress toward New York State Education Department (NYSED) learning standards and promotion benchmarks in ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies and Health. You can continue to monitor your child's grades on a daily basis, using the google classroom reports. Please contact your child's teacher if you have any questions or concerns.

All students have been invited to complete the 2022 Student Perception Survey. Questions on the survey ask how your child is experiencing their classes, such as how supported your child feels by their teacher, and whether they find lessons engaging. All student survey responses are kept completely confidential, which means no one in the school will know how your child responded. Students are not asked to type in their names or ID numbers on the survey. Highlights for Grade 6

Math— We will continue working on finding percentages. Thursday will be a review day of unit 3. On Friday, students will take the end of the unit's assessment.
