MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

Punxtawney Phil has prognosticated six more weeks of winter, so please remember that in the event of an emergency closing, we will communicate via robocall, text, and email, and we will post to our school website.

As we begin the month of February, we recognize a month-long celebration of Black history. While this is a time when we lift up these stories, the contributions of Black Americans are embedded in our curriculum and learning experiences. This coming month, there will be events at the Tuckahoe Public Library, and we encourage families to celebrate and support our students' study of Black history.

This week, we celebrated the unveiling of our MS/HS cafeteria. The bright, airy space with modern flourishes was received with excitement by our students. The new space includes bench seating, modern technology with built-in charging stations, and tables that offer areas for small groups to gather, eat, and study together.



Thank you to our community for their support of this project. In the coming weeks, we look forward to receiving the new furniture and cutting the ribbon to our new MS/HS library. Much

like the impressive upgrades to our Cottle Field, the new MS/HS spaces catapult our spaces into the future!

Speaking of the future, we encourage everyone to check out our capital project website, where we have information about our proposed bond and a communication timeline. On February 15th, the community will be asked to come out to the polls for a vote on a bond referendum to fund this work. This project includes a renovation and modernization of the Cottle Cafeteria; much-needed infrastructure repairs in the middle/high school building so that broken and deteriorated pipes and areas of the tunnel are fixed/replaced and partial roof replacements to ensure students/teachers have well-functioning heat and will no longer be assigned to classes because of leaks. New air conditioning and ventilation will be installed in all three schools to match the new wing air exchange systems for the health and wellness of the staff and students.


Cost of Proposed Capital Project 2023


Math in the Real World






