(I) Overview of the approved items from the February 2<sup>nd</sup> Executive Committee meeting Susan Reid, NYSPHSAA Female AD Rep & Rob Pollok, NYSPHSAA Male AD Rep

Susan Reid reported the following to the Athletic Council:

- Six Classification Criteria: Based upon the concerns shared at the Athletic Council meeting our state reps did not support the six-classification proposal. However, the majority of Sections supported the proposal.
- Six Classification Process, Timeline: Carried, unanimously by all 11 Sections
- Cheer State Championship Venue: Originated as a discussion item but was moved to an action item regarding spectator limitations or changing the venue to provide the least restrictive environment for student-athletes. While our Section supported this action item, the proposal was defeated by the State Executive Committee.
- Wrestling & Basketball Proposal: Originated as a discussion item but was moved to an action item regarding spectator limitations. Our Section has continued to support a venue and

experience that embraces the least restrictive environment. In this instance, both venues had a testing option that provided all with the opportunity to attend and compete.

They hope to offer soccer, tennis & lacrosse through mergers with Hastings UFSD. Some language exists on social media or websites and the application references moving toward K-12. The application is a K-8 application and would only be valid for the modified programming.

# XVII. Membership Concerns

Spectator Behavior – Pearl River Basketball
 Joe Sigillo, Nyack AD & Andy Guccione, Suffern AD

## Joe Sigillo, Nyack AD, reported the following concerns to the Athletic Council:

- An incident occurred at the February 9<sup>th</sup>, Nyack vs. Pearl River Varsity Boys Basketball game involving Pearl River spectators.
- The initial incident included student spectators making noises resembling a monkey while a student of color was on the free throw line. Highly inappropriate and racially insensitive comments created an unsafe environment. These behaviors continued after the initial incident occurred and were captured on video.
- Pearl River supervisors and administrators who were present at the game did not address the issue beyond speaking with the student spectators at the time of the initial incident. No one was removed from the game.
- Racially driven chants and other inappropriate actions continued to occur throughout the remainder of the event which went unaddressed by administration.

### Andy Guccione, Suffern AD, reported the following to the Athletic Council:

- A letter was drafted by the Suffern School District and shared with the Section 1 office stating that on Friday, January 28<sup>th</sup>, "during the course of the game, Suffern players were subjected to taunts and highly sensitive remarks which included racially driven statements and chants from Pearl River fans".
- The incidents were reported to Pearl River administration and Suffern acknowledged the district was taking the matter serious and was currently in the process of investigating.

• When learning of a similar incident at Nyack, Suffern felt compelled to report their experience as well.

## Overview of Section One's oversight:

- Section One released a statement to the media regarding the Nyack vs. Pearl River incident. A copy was enclosed in the meeting packet.
- o It was shared by the Section One Executive Director that it is the role of the school districts involved to investigate any incidents occurring at interscholastic athletic events.
- o It is the role of the Section to support all districts involved and provide guidance as the district administration investigates the incident via DASA and/or Title VI.
- The Section One leadership will continue to engage outside resources to aid and support the districts involved.
- o If there is no resolution between the involved districts, it is at this stage, that the Section would intervene to assist in addressing the situation.
- Providing the opportunity for the Pearl River School District to share the steps they have taken to address the reported issues inclusive of their event management plan to ensure a safe environment for upcoming interscholastic athletic events is a priority of the Athletic Council.

## Pearl River Administration (AD & Principal) reported the following to the Athletic Council:

- The Pearl River administration was invited to present their event management plan that would ensure a safe environment for all in attendance for upcoming postseason events.
- Additional law enforcement, school administrators and event supervisors will be added for all upcoming events hosted at Pearl River.
- For their upcoming postseason home games, they plan to limit home spectators to a "manageable number" and limit away spectators to two per player.
- A series of other changes are anticipated to occur including the use of a QR code to be used to register students in attendance and the addition of sportsmanship signage in the gymnasium.
- Educational awareness and sensitivity trainings will be facilitated as part of ongoing work within the district.

#### Discussion of possible sanctions being considered by the Athletic Council:

- Postpone the game that is scheduled for today until a determination can be made regarding the appropriate path forward
- Pending investigation, recommend no student spectators (or the possible limitation of all spectators)

o Move all scheduled contests to their opponent's site for the duration of the post-season.
