PROPOSITION # 1: KLSD BUDGET

The first proposition on the ballot is the Katonah-Lewisboro School District's operating budget for the 2023-24 school year. The proposed budget supports and strengthens the outstanding academic program offered within the Katonah-Lewisboro School District while being fiscally responsible. The budget is below the New York State tax levy cap.


PROPOSITION # 2: BUS REPLACEMENT WITH ELECTRIC, HYBRID OR FUEL VEHICLES

In addition to the general fund budget proposal, you will have an opportunity to vote on a proposition to transfer funds from the 2022-23 general fund to the capital fund to replace up to six district school buses, vans and service trucks with electric, hybrid or fuel vehicles. If approved, there would

be no impact to taxes and no additional debt would be incurred. The replacement of buses and vans on a rotational basis is important to maintaining safe, dependable transportation for our students. In total, all the vehicles in this proposition would be purchased at a cost not to exceed \$950,000.





^{*} Assuming revenues other than tax levy remain as presented in the original budget, a contingent budget would require \$1,588,409 of reductions to the general fund budget. This would necessitate elimination of the following: \$26,000 – community use of facilities, \$377,183 – instructional, operations and maintenance, and transportation equipment purchases, and \$1,185,226 of other reductions (program expenses, capital expenses, and administrative expenses). If necessary, the actual cuts to the proposed budget in the amount of \$1,588,409 would be made by the Administration and the Board of Education pursuant to Section 2023 of Education Law.

The annual budget vote for the fiscal year 2023-24 by the qualified voters of the Katonah-Lewisboro School District, Westchester County, New York, will be held at Katonah Elementary School, Increase Miller Elementary School and Meadow Pond Elementary School in said District on Tuesday, May 16, 2023 between the hours of 6:00 am and 9:00 pm, prevailing time, at which time the polls will be opened to vote by voting ballot or machine.

^{1.} The basic school tax relief (STAR) exemption is authorized by section 425 of the Real Property Tax Law.

VOTER INFORMATION

The complete proposed budget is available at **klschools.org/budget**.

All District residents registered to vote with Westchester County are automatically registered to vote in their school district's budget and school board election. If you are not registered to vote, you may register at any of the schools in the district or at the District Office between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. on regular school/business days, as well as at the District Office on Saturday, May 6, 2023 between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. Registration is open through Thursday, May 11, 2023.

Voter Qualifications

An individual must:

- Be a U.S. citizen, 18 years of age or older.
- Have been a resident of the school district for 30 days preceding the day of the vote.

Absentee Ballots

Absentee ballots are permitted in all school board elections and/or referenda. Absentee ballots may be cast by a qualified voter who is:

- A patient in a hospital or who is unable to vote because of illness or physical disability.
- Out of the county of residence on election day because of business, vacation or other duty.

Requesting Absentee Ballots

Any person seeking an absentee ballot must complete an application obtained from District Clerk Kimberly Monzon or downloaded from the district's website, klschools.org, and return it to the District Clerk by mail or in person.

If the application is returned by mail, it must be received by the District Clerk by Tuesday, May 9, 2023. If the application is delivered personally, it must be received by the District Clerk no later than 5 p.m. on Monday, May 15, 2023. The District Office is located at 60 North Salem Road, Cross River, NY 10518.

Once the District Clerk receives the application, an absentee ballot will be mailed to the address specified on the application. Absentee ballots must be received by the District Clerk no later than 5 p.m. on Tuesday, May 16, 2023. It is possible to deliver the completed application, complete the actual ballot and turn it in on the same day.





