




Understanding Kinematics with Simulations



Learning by phenomenon! Students in Ms. Burke's Physics course use fan carts with motion sensors and graphical analysis software to understand the relationships between the concepts of velocity and acceleration. This is part of the physics unit on kinematics (motion). This will help students to understand velocity and acceleration are vector quantities, which means that you must account for the direction of both the velocity and the acceleration to determine if an object will speed up or slow down. Students enjoyed using the new equipment, especially the fan carts. They soon realized that in a race, they could not outrun a fan cart. This was proof that the fan car continued to accelerate at a uniform rate even when they no longer could!






