ELIGIBILITY

NYSPHSAA Handbook

#26 Representation Rule

Minimum Number of Contests To be eligible for sectional, intersectional or state competition, a team must have completed in **six (6)** school scheduled contests which occurred on **six (6)** different dates during the season.

Team Sports: An individual is eligible for the team if he/she has been an eligible participant on a team in that sport in that school for a minimum of **six (6)** scheduled contests during the regular season.

ENTERING THE SECTIONAL TOURNAMENT

1. The following actions are the responsibility of the school/coach and need to be taken prior to the Seeding meeting. A link and reminders to complete these forms will go out through BOCES to your AD's:
 - a. Officials Ratings (submitted via Sportspak)
 - b. Non-Preferred Officials (submitted via Google Survey)
2. Schools must keep their schedule and game scores up-to-date on the Section One Score Board platform (www.section1athletics.org). For questions or concerns, please have your Athletic office contact Wanda Maffia in the Section One office at (914) 592-2526.
3. Please check with your Athletic Director if you are not familiar with ScoreBoard.
4. Both schools need to enter the results, as this is a way of confirming the result of the game.
5. The "Section Result" sheet will be pulled by the Section One office on or around the last day to play and be considered the official record for the school. It is extremely important that the schedule and scores included on your "Section Result" page is accurate because you will be attesting to it's accuracy for the purpose of seeding. This process has replaced the Game Result Sheet that was used in the past.

NOTE: All games to date must be entered in [Score Board](#) no later than Tuesday October 19th, 2021 at noon. Schools are required to provide the sports chair(s) with the scores and results from games held after the submission of Score Board results.

GENERAL PROCEDURES FOR RUNNING POST SEASON FIELD HOCKEY MATCHES

1. The winning coach shall **report scores to the Field Hockey Sport Chairs** on the night the game was played.
2. For a home game, the host school is responsible for:
 - a. Chaperones
 - b. Timer, Score table, Scorekeeper and horn
 - c. Game balls, corner flags
 - d. Section One Field Hockey Booklet
 - e. Federation Rule Book
3. For all Championship Games, the event host will supply:
 - a. Announcer
 - b. Scoreboard Operator
 - c. Site Coordinator

PROTEST PROCEDURES

1. Any protest procedures already established by the rules governing the sport must be followed.
2. General Sectional protest procedures:
 - a. Any coach lodging a protest will immediately notify an official (preferably head official) of the contest.
 - b. Immediately following the game or meet, all officials and coaches involved must be notified.
 - c. All details of the protest must be put in writing immediately following the game or meet and before the game leaving the field.
 - d. All written protests must be turned over to any member of the Sectional Sports Committee. If no member of the Committee is present, the head official shall accept the protest and be responsible for getting it to someone on the Committee.
 - e. The Protest Committee will make the final decision on all protests. This Committee will consist of all members of the Sectional Sports Committee, at least one neutral official, and any other members deemed necessary by the Sports Chairperson. League representatives of the schools involved will not vote on the decision.
 - f. The coaches involved will be informed of the Committee's decision as soon as possible.
 - g. The Chairperson and a neutral official will determine if a situation may be protested.
3. Specific Field Hockey Procedures:
 - a. A protest **cannot** be made regarding a judgment call.
 - b. Protests can only be filed for a misapplication of the rules.
 - c. A protest must be made immediately following the alleged misapplication and has to be announced to officials **prior to the next play**.
 - d. The Head Coach, not an assistant, must inform a field official or table official of their intent to protest prior to the next play.
 - e. The Official Federation Rules for School Girls Guide states that "the Rules Committee does not make decisions on protests of games by leagues. Problems arising during a game should be solved immediately on the field, and coaches, when they hire officials, agree to abide by their decisions".

PROTEST PROCEDURES Continued

4. **Sectional Finals Protest Procedure:** Any and all questions and/or protests as to game rules and the conduct of the games shall be resolved by the Games Committee (Section Coordinator, Field Marshall and neutral official).
NOTE: All decisions shall be final with no right of appeal. Each coach should have a Tournament Handbook and current rule book on site.
5. **Regional Protest Procedure When Hosted By Section One:** Any and all questions and/or protests as to game rules and the conduct of the games shall be resolved by the Games Committee (Section Coordinators from each section and neutral official)
NOTE: All decisions shall be final with no right of appeal. Each coach should have a Tournament Handbook and current rule book on site.

OVERTIME PROCEDURES - Postseason Only

1. 10 minute period of 7 v. 7 sudden victory
2. If a tie Still exists after the first 10 minute overtime, the teams will play a second 7 v. 7 sudden victory 10 minute overtime.
3. If still a tie, a 1 v. 1 Shootout takes place. There should be no "NO SUDDEN VICTORY" shoot-out process. A set of 5 alternating shoot outs take place in each series. Field Hockey overtime procedures will be a ten (10) second one-on-one from Sectional play and beyond. Penalty strokes have been eliminated.

SUSPENDED GAME PROCEDURE

Suspended Play Process is the same for the regular season and postseason. If the game is suspended in the 1st half, the game is resumed from the point of interruption. If a game is suspended in the 2nd half, the coaches can agree it is a completed game. If they don't agree, it is to resume at the point of interruption as soon as possible.

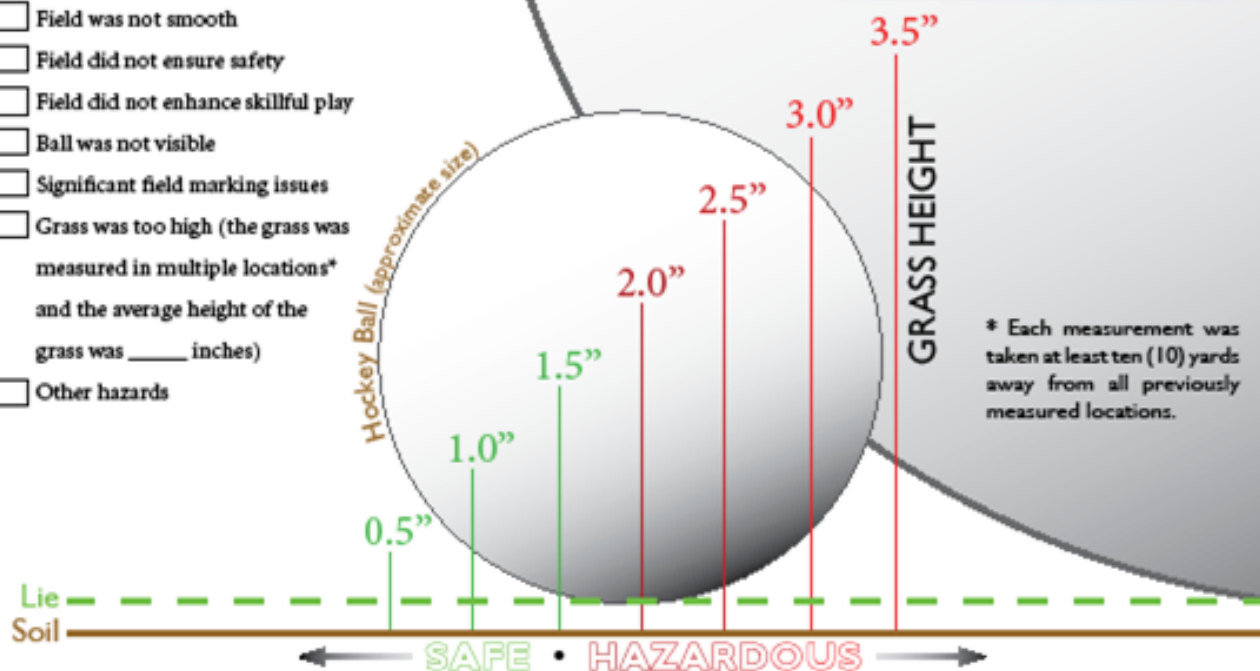
