General Information

6th grade history classes went to innovation Lab in October after studying the geography, climate and nature resources available to each of the regions. Students had to build their own shelter and then discuss what adaptations they could make in event of a natural catastrophe. The 6th grade history teachers planned together with Dr. Spott for this activity.

For the first semester, the Innovation Lab has hosted 2063 student visits for 20 different lessons. Nearly every student has had at least one lesson in the lab already, including six collaborative teams and multiple self-contained classes.





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Even with COVID-19 mitigation procedures in place, teachers focused on providing students with collaborative learning opportunities.


This is an example of 7th grade students playing scientific notation war.



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This is an example of students in a 7th grade social studies class working collaboratively to analyze and explain documents and photos of social reforms presented during the Progressive Movement.




The stromboli from Family and Consumer Science class smelled delicious!
