Rye Neck schools are distinguished by strong leadership, academic excellence and a clear vision for the future, making it a premier Westchester County public school district. Its educational team consistently strives to improve teaching practices, maximize resources and ensure that facilities meet our stakeholders' standards.

At each grade level, the district is focused on educating the whole child, ensuring access and equity for all. Unique Programs include a Schoolwide Enrichment Model, STEAM activities, the Wonder Studio in grades K-2 and the Idea Lab in grades 3-5. Instruction in French, Italian and Spanish begins in Grade 6. About 5% of students are English Language Learners. Recent capital improvements include a middle school gymnasium addition; a two-story STEAM science center added at the high school; and new roofs and other repairs districtwide.



Rye Neck High School is a National School of Excellence and a comprehensive college preparatory school. Eighty-six percent of graduates go on to two- or four-year colleges and universities. Students in all grades choose from among two dozen Advanced Placement courses. World languages studies include Spanish, French and Italian, and students may choose an Arts Sequence with AP Studio Art. Other offerings include a Senior Internship Program; Science Research Program; Independent Learner Program; College and University Partnerships; Mock Trial; Model UN; Student Senate and Science Olympiad.

Professional familiarity and comfort with the responsibilities and challenges of a smaller K-12 school district is paramount, as is an appreciation for the importance of local school culture and establishment of one's leadership profile within it.

Candidates should possess, at minimum, senior-level central office experience or tenured building-level leadership experience. PK-12 teaching/pupil services experience is required. An earned doctorate is preferred and necessary NY administrative certifications are required.

Downstate NY leadership experience is preferred, but not required. The school district is a proponent of diversity and inclusion priorities in hiring and welcomes inquiries from all qualified professionals.
