Dear Guidance Counselors,

We are pleased to announce that we are once again offering our ***Crystal Run Healthcare's Young Physicians Program*** to Rockland County High School Juniors and Seniors at our West Nyack facility. As you may recall from years past, the program, designed for students interested in pursuing a career in the medical field, will entail weekly lectures and interactive discussions/demonstrations in a variety of medical specialties and settings. Through the program, students will have exposure to Physicians who are experts in their specialty of choice, as well as leaders in our local health care community. While students will have direct interaction with Physicians, there will be no interaction with patients.

The sessions, held on Tuesday evenings from 6:00-7:00 pm in the Spring of 2020 will highlight a variety of topics including, but not limited to: current screening recommendations for cancer, heart disease and prevention, new innovations and technologies in medicine, vaccination recommendations, and the current state of health care.

The first session will begin March 3, 2020 and run through April 28, 2020. (excluding April 14, 2019)

At the culmination of the program, students will be asked to prepare a recommendation with improvements that his or her school can implement to improve the health of its students and teachers.

All students who attend each session will receive a certificate for 10 observation and participation hours that they can use when applying for college. This certificate will be pro-rated depending on attendance.
