

COMMUNITY OVERVIEW

Port Chester High School is located on a 20 acre campus on the border between the villages of Port Chester and Rye Brook in Westchester County, New York. The school has provided quality education to the students of Port Chester and neighboring portions of Rye Brook since 1932.

Port Chester is a wonderfully diverse suburban community on Long Island Sound, approximately 27 miles from Manhattan. The village of two square miles and over 29,000 residents is a former manufacturing center that is home now to a commercial and residential rebirth centered on multimillion dollar developments and expansion of its downtown and harbor areas.

Port Chester High School shares the district's mission of "Success For Every Student." Our school is the flagship of the district, an institution that students and staff are proud to call home.

COCURRICULAR ACTIVITIES AND ATHLETIC OPPORTUNITIES

Port Chester High School recognizes the educational value inherent in student participation in the life of the school. A strong activities program is available to students and is designed to meet their school-related interests and needs. We offer opportunities for students to develop and grow through participation in numerous cocurricular and athletic activities.

In the pulsing beat of the award winning marching band, one hears the drumming of the heart of the school. As our athletes race across field and court, one feels the adrenaline rush of Ram pride. And in art, choir, orchestra, theatre, journalism, student government, and a multitude of activities, students can challenge their potential and broaden themselves.

Special recognition is offered through the National Honor Society, Mathematics Honor Society (Mu Alpha Theta), Science Honor Society, Tri-M Music Honor Society, National Art Honor Society, National English Honor Society, National Thespian Honor Society, and the French, Italian, and Spanish National Honor Societies.

About a third of our students participate in at least one sport. Port Chester High School offers a full boys and girls interscholastic sports program at the modified, junior varsity, and varsity levels.

STUDENT BODY AND FACULTY

Port Chester High School is a four-year, comprehensive high school accredited by the New York State Board of Regents and the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools. Students may select a program of studies that includes honors and college preparatory courses, Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate courses, fine art studies, special education, English as new language, bilingual programs, and vocational education through the Board of Cooperative Educational Services.

Our students share diverse racial, ethnic, cultural, educational, and socioeconomic backgrounds and represent over 28 nations. Some have lived in the district for generations, while many others have only recently immigrated to the United States. About one-third of our students are current or former English Language Learners, and our cultural diversity enriches the school community and educational environment.

Over 1,541 students are enrolled—84 percent are Hispanic, 11 percent are white (non-Hispanic), 3 percent are black, and 2 percent are from other backgrounds. A culturally rich student body is one of our greatest strengths, and together we look to build on the school's legacy and rich traditions.

The professional staff at Port Chester High School includes 109 teachers, 7 counselors, 11 teaching assistants, 3 psychologists, a social worker, a librarian, 2 school nurses, 8 office staff, 22 other support staff, and 4 administrators. The faculty is committed to providing a supportive learning environment and to the development of each student's potential.

Students are supported by professionals who value the importance of academic achievement and are dedicated to ensuring that students receive the highest quality education possible. Everyone here feels part of a team whose mission is to help students do their best by creating a positive atmosphere that permits students to learn and teachers to teach.

GRADUATE PROFILE

Over half of our graduates are the first in their families to pursue higher education. The percent of our students who do go on to college is a testament to their commitment to overcoming the often linguistic, financial, and cultural challenges that they face.
