Quality teaching is key to improving student achievement

Quality board governance is key to quality teaching and to improving student achievement.

Local control of education through elected school boards is the best way to ensure that public policy reflects student and community needs.

Public education is the foundation of our democratic society and the key to successful schools and successful students.

Public education **spending** is an essential investment in Wyoming's future.

All Wyoming children deserve **school buildings** that support the delivery of the "educational basket of goods", (including appropriate space for student activities), provide a safe and secure environment for learning, and have a positive impact on their communities.

EIGHT CHARACTERISTICS OF EFFECTIVE SCHOOL BOARDS

Research has shown that an effective, high-achieving board – that is, one that impacts student achievement – exhibit habits and characteristics that are markedly different from boards in low-achieving districts. In the most dramatic examples from this research, scholars compared districts with similar levels of poverty and disadvantage to determine factors that separate high-performing districts from those with low performance. In many cases, these differences included the approaches taken by local school boards.

1. Effective school boards commit to a vision of high expectations for student achievement and quality instruction and define clear goals toward that vision.
2. Effective school boards have strong shared beliefs and values about what is possible for students and their ability to learn, and of the system and its ability to teach all children at high levels.
3. Effective school boards are accountability driven, spending less time on operational issues and more time focused on policies to improve student achievement.
4. Effective school boards have a collaborative relationship with staff and the community and establish a strong communications structure to inform and engage both internal and external stakeholders in setting and achieving district goals.
5. Effective boards are data savvy; they embrace and monitor data, even when the information is negative, and use it to drive continuous improvement.
6. Effective school boards align and sustain resources, such as professional development, to meet district goals.
7. Effective school boards lead as a united team with the superintendent, each from their respective roles, with strong collaboration and mutual trust.
8. Effective school boards take part in team development and training, sometimes with their superintendents, to build shared knowledge, values and commitments for their improvement efforts.



WSBA AWARDS PROGRAM

The Certified Board Member Program is a voluntary program established by the Wyoming School Boards Association to encourage school board members to improve their effectiveness. With the tremendous change and ever increasing demands for productivity and efficiency in education, ongoing board development is essential in meeting today's challenges. Certification increases board members' credibility by demonstrating to their community that school board members are serious public servants.

To carry out their governance role effectively, it is necessary for board members to understand the role of a school board member and keep abreast of changing times and circumstances. Board members must be familiar with the many elements of the district's educational operations. This needed expertise comes through formal training programs, through personal experience, as well as sharing in the experiences of other board members.
