The motto I live by is, "Be the type of energy that no matter where you go, you always add value to the



I've also worked with children before coming to the NYCDOE. I was a Behavior Training Assistant and worked with autistic children. The kids were fun.



The one thing I want people to remember about me is that I am well rounded.





I make the best Arroz con Gandules in the world, which is rice with pigeon peas.



My favorite dish would be BBQ Ribs and a baked potato with a virgin pina colada.




