


<u>Directions for Access to the "Universal Literacy Family Presentation Series" on Parent University</u>


1. Create a NYC School Account

Families have access to Parent University using their registered NYC School Account (NYCSA). To create an account, families will first be asked to validate their email, and then use an "account creation code" provided by their child's school, to add students. Use the link: https://parentu.schools.nyc/ to get started.



2. Sign in to Parent University

Once registered, families can sign into the Parent University site using their NYCSA user name and password. There is a wealth of opportunities for families to explore including both on-demand, recorded courses and live online courses! Translation in over 100 languages is provided by selecting the preferred language on the home page.









3. <u>Search Course Catalog for Universal Literacy Presentation Series</u>

Entering the key term, "K-2 literacy" in the course name will populate each of the family presentations prepared by the Universal Literacy Team. The series, "Supporting K-2 Literacy at Home" includes presentations by reading coaches on Oral Language, Phonological and Phonemic Awareness, Phonics, Fluency, Vocabulary, Comprehension and Writing. Families can also search by entering a particular topic in the course name, such as "Phonics".



4. Select a Course and Enroll

Select "Course Details" to get a more detailed description of the course. Select "Enroll" to have the course added to your "My Courses" tab.








5. Start the Course
