Steger School District 194 Congratulates the Class of 2023

On Monday, June 5th 2023, Steger School District 194 celebrated the graduation of Columbia Central's class of 2023. More than 900 were in attendance in Columbia's main gym that evening including dignitaries from the villages of Steger and South Chicago Heights as well as the District 194 Board of Trustees.

The evening began with a welcome from National Junior Honor Society representative Lola Spada. Spada welcomed the Bloom Trail JROTC Color Guard before leading those in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, 8th graders Adrien Perdue and Kendra Killham lead the Columbia Central Band and Choir in the singing of The Star Spangled Banner.

Acting Superintendent and former Steger 194 graduate Dr. Patricia Hahto then began the proceedings with brief remarks to the graduates. Hahto urged graduates to follow their dreams stating, "I hold this district, everyone who works here and everyone who is educated here close to my heart. As a fellow graduate, my message to the Class of 2023 is this - You can, indeed, achieve your dreams. Your years as a Steger 194 student and a graduate of Columbia Central have served you well. My advice is to make the most of all the good things you've learned as you move forward in your life.'

Following Dr. Hahto, Valedictorian Aryana Knaack spoke to her classmates. She urged them to remember back to the many setbacks faced by the class of 2023. Knaack recognized, "Review packets replaced learning new things. Then in August 2020, for 6th grade we started online classes and Google Meets. Learning online was hard, but we

persevered." Knaack then quoted Teddy Roosevelt's famous speech "The Man in the Arena." Knaack noted that today, she and the other students joining her on stage as Salutatorian, NJHS representative, and Student Council representative were the women in the arena.

Registration Information

Beginning, July 14, 2023, the registration portal will be open to help expedite the form filling process for registration. This year, parents/guardians will complete and submit most registration documents online. Once you have submitted your updated portal information, you will immediately be notified of your residency verification status. All new students and randomly selected returning students will be required to prove residency at any of the Registration/Help days listed below.

In order to begin the online registration process, the parent/guardian will need access to the internet and must utilize the access ID # and Password included in the mailing being sent out on July 10, 2023, to all returning families and any families that attended Kindergarten Night and turned in a copy of their child's birth certificate.

In order to help facilitate the use of internet access, District 194 is providing the opportunity for parents/guardians to utilize the computers at Columbia Central School on various days and times. **Parents of new students (including kindergartners & Pre-School Program students) are encouraged to visit** during these times to obtain access to the registration portal. <u>A copy of the new student's birth certificate is required to receive access to</u> the registration portal.

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*Last day to fill out the online registration or residency verification (if required). If you have a returning student and the online process is not completed on August 2nd a full registration will be required at Parkview School on the first day of school.

Three documents are required to verify residency at registration. Without these documents, the family will not be able to register. One (1) document from Category A and two (2) documents from Category B are required. If you are residing with a Steger resident, the homeowner is required to prove residency. Additionally, you must supply at least one document from Category B, if residing with a Steger resident. Everyone must have all required residency information to continue the registration process. If not, you will be asked to return with the necessary documentation. If registration is not completed on August 1st or August 2nd, you will not receive the \$50 discount for attending registration days.

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A Word From Superintendent Dr. Patricia Hahto

Dear Steger School District 194 Community Members,

It is my pleasure to be your Acting Superintendent of Schools in Steger. I served the district once before in this capacity. When I came aboard in 2016, the Steger administrators, faculty and staff welcomed me with open arms and I ending up staying for 3 ½ years. This time, I am once again getting that family feeling that SD 194 has been known for these many years. I appreciate it so very much.

Things have changed for the better in the four years I have been away. Here are some examples.

For one thing, the Professional Learning Communities paradigm has become more widely understood and applied throughout the district. Learning coaches have done a great job in helping teachers to come together as a team to improve student learning. You'll see what I mean when the district publishes the results of the Illinois Assessment of Readiness. Our English Language Arts scores have improved a lot thanks to the hard work of the teachers, learning coaches and principals under the guidance of Director of Teaching and Learning Jan Lenci.

Another example has to do with an upgrade in technology within the

district. Teachers now use Smart TVs which allow them, among other things, to project whatever is on their laptop screens onto the larger Smart TV screen to instruct students.

Additionally, we have adopted a new math textbook series called Eureka Squared. The series is tightly configured to the Illinois Math Standards. The learning coaches will be helping teachers with the ins and outs of the series as implementation takes place.

It's an exciting time in Steger SD 194 and I am pleased to be able to be a part of watching the district grow in service to our students. As you probably know, our mission is all about "learning and growing together." And that's exactly what we are doing.
