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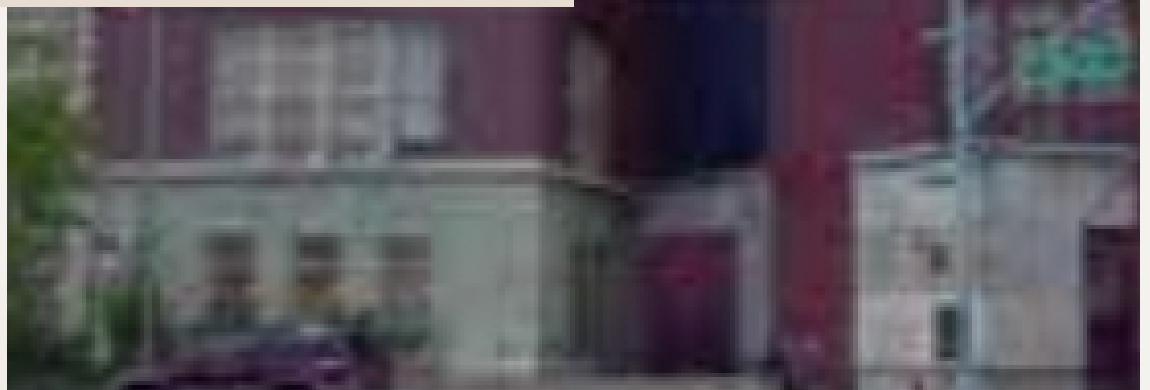
## A Message from the Principal

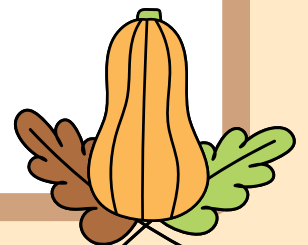



## A Recipe For All for Fall

### Ingredients

- \*3/4 cup sugar
- \*1 1/2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice
- \*1/2 teaspoon salt
- \*1 can (15 oz) pumpkin (not pumpkin pie mix)
- \*1 1/4 cups evaporated milk or half and half
- \*2 eggs, beaten
- \*1 crust from 1 package (12 oz) frozen Deep Dish Pie Crusts (2 Count)

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\*Heat oven to 425°F.

\*In large bowl, beat sugar, pumpkin pie spice, salt, pumpkin, evaporated milk and eggs with wire whisk until well blended.

\*Place frozen pie crust onto cookie sheet.

\*Pour filling into pie crust. Place filled pie crust on cookie sheet into preheated oven. .

\*Bake 15 minutes. Reduce oven temperature to 350°F; bake 40 to 50 minutes longer or until knife inserted near center comes out clean.

\*Cool on cooling rack at least 2 hours. Serve or refrigerate until serving time. Store in refrigerator.

Children learn the meanings of most words indirectly, through everyday experiences with oral and written language. Children learn word meanings indirectly in three ways:

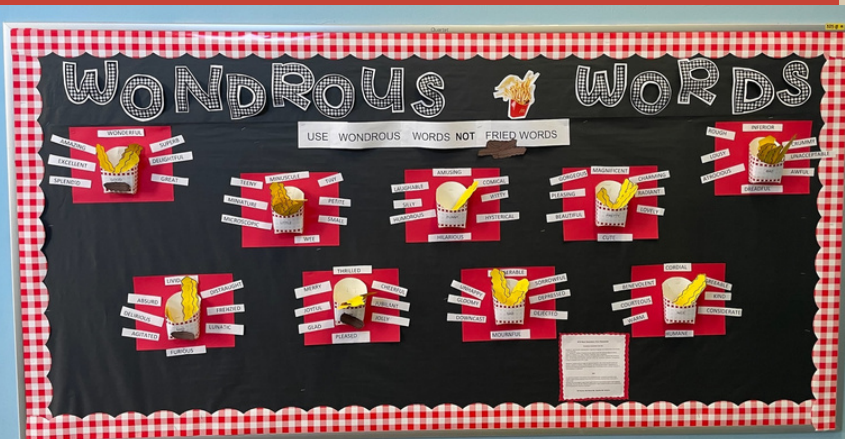

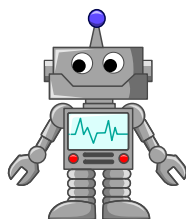
## Thinking Like a Computer Scientist
