Keynote Speaker: Michael Rich, MD, MPH, is Associate Professor of Pediatrics at Harvard Medical School, Associate Professor of Social and Behavioral Sciences at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health, and practices Adolescent Medicine at Boston Children's Hospital. Pediatrician, researcher, father, and filmmaker, Dr. Rich is the Founder and Director of the Center on Media and Child Health (CMCH) and the first evidence-based medical program addressing physical, mental and social health issues associated with digital technology, the Clinic for

Interactive Media and Internet Disorders (CIMAID).

KEYNOTE ► PARRY AFTAB



When Experience Meets Youth – a cross-generational discussion on digital well-being, privacy and cybersafety with cyberlaw pioneer Parry Aftab, Esq. and her award-winning teen experts – the Teenangels.

Since 1998, Parry's Teenangels have been her secret weapon, spotting digital issues and solutions. They have addressed the UN, the US Senate, the UK House of Lords and have helped tens of thousands of their peers stay safer online. They

helped design MTV's digital abuse initiative, advise Google and Microsoft, Gov. Cuomo and train FBI agents. They inspired and helped design the Girl Scouts of the USA's cybersafety program.

Together, the young teens and Parry will share their insights and coach participants to build a student-expert team for their own schools.

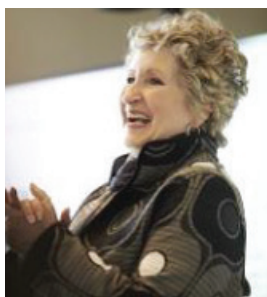
TLI ACTIVE=CON

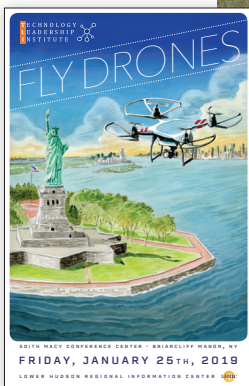

KEYNOTE ► DR. DEVORAH HEITNER

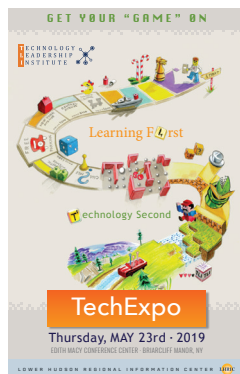

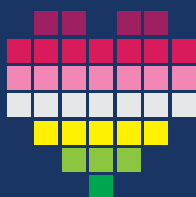
