Acceleration in mathematics and earth science is available beginning in the eighth grade. Grade Weighting/Class Rank

Pearl River School District reports an <u>unweighted GPA with a weighted rank</u> using a numerical grading system. High Honors and Honor Roll lists are computed each of the four marking periods for those students carrying the equivalent of six courses, one of which is Physical Education. In addition, a yearly honor roll will be computed for honors achievement in all four quarters:

High Honors overall average of 90 and above, no failures, no incompletes Honors overall average of 85-89.99, no failures, no incompletes

Averages are done at the conclusion of the sixth semester and include all failures, summer school, and repeated courses. All subjects are included in the GPA with the exception of Physical Education. Transcript grades are not weighted. Weights used for ranking are as follows:
