To support lessons on space systems, fifth-grade teacher Ms. Guiffra invited Mr. Christopher Centi, an astronomer and space science educator, to meet virtually with her students. Known as "C the Rocket Man," Mr. Centi is owner and CEO of Centi Astro-Space Activities. He advocates for hands-on science, is an author of various articles, and has appeared on radio and TV. Chris was instrumental in developing and building the planetarium for the Lucile M. Wright Air Museum in Jamestown, NY, and served as the Planetarium Director and Space Science Coordinator from November 2012 to December 2016. His involvement with many Astronomy and Space Science organizations has led him to several research interests including: studying exoplanets and the search for life elsewhere, Mars exploration, categorizing and researching various projects for Zooniverse, psychological implications of long term space travel and developing useful hands-on activities to teach science. Cottle scientists submitted questions about zero gravity and the inner workings of telescopes. They learned a lot in this very informative session!



TUCKAHOE UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT ANNOUNCES KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Registration for Kindergarten students for the 2023-2024 school year will be held on **Wednesday, January 25, 2023** and **Thursday, January 26, 2024**. Children who will be five years of age by December 1, 2023 are eligible to attend Kindergarten.

Parents/Legal Guardians are urged to register children according to the following schedule, utilizing the first letter of the child's last name:

Wednesday, January 25, 2023 9:00AM – 11:00AM A – L

Thursday, January 26, 2023 9:00AM – 11:00AM M – Z

Registration takes place at the William E. Cottle Elementary School, 2 Siwanoy Boulevard, Eastchester, New York in the Auditorium. At the time of registration, parents/legal guardians must bring the required registration forms, which can be found on the District's website (www.tuckahoeschools.org), filled out and notarized along with the following documents:

Three (3) Proofs of Residence

Parents/Legal Guardians must bring originals and copies of the following documents:

1. Property tax bill, deed, co-op shares, <u>Or</u> a signed current lease (valid through June 2024)

AND

2. Con Edison bill, cable bill, phone bill, Or current income tax return

AND

3. NYS Driver's License, NYS Registration <u>Or</u> NYS Insurance Card with your current address

AND

- Your Child's Proof of Age

 (i.e., birth certificate, passport, baptismal certificate, etc.)
- Your Child's Immunization Record including date of last physical exam
- If you are divorced or separated, please bring a copy of your Custody Agreement.
