MISSION STATEMENT

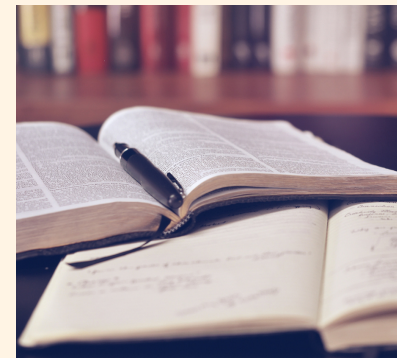
The PS 14 Mission is to create a community where students, parents, and staff work together to inspire leaders who innovate, own their learning, and empower one another so we can be our best selves.

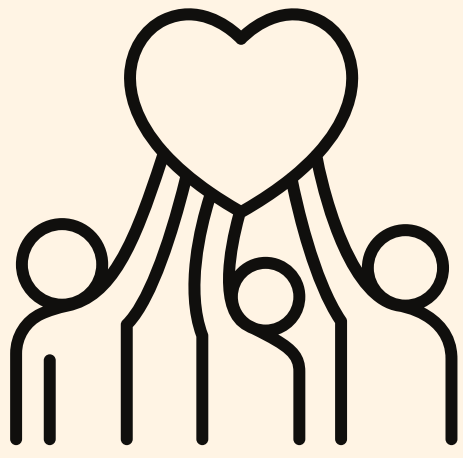

First Grade



ELA (SLA FOR DL)

Our classes will learn that animal bodies and animal homes come in many different shapes and sizes. We will read books about animal characteristics, and we will learn how animals use their bodies to survive. Children will explore animals further by writing a research essay about their favorite animals.

MATH

Your child is learning about addition and subtraction using numerals to 10. They will learn to count on to solve addition problems and count back to solve subtraction problems. They will also learn about the relationship between addition and subtraction.

FUNDATIONS

We have been working on three-sound words, and sentences as well as "trick" words. We are practicing to read consonant digraphs such as "s" and "h" together make the sound of /sh/. We know we that the sound /k/ at the end of a word is usually spelled with the letters "ck."

SPANISH PHONICS (DL)

In the upcoming weeks, our students will be focusing on reviewing and mastering: r, rr, ca, co, cu, que, qui We will also be working with syllables that incorporate each of these consonants to reinforce their phonics skills.

As readers, we have wrapped up Module 2: Come to Your Senses where we learned through reading different texts how we use our senses to help us perceive the world around us and have started Module 3: Rise to the Occassion where we are learning how we overcome the many different types of challenges we face.

As writers, we wrapped up Module 2 where we learned how to write informative description pieces about amazing animals and have started learning how to write opinion pieces on how friends and family help us to overcome the challenges we face.



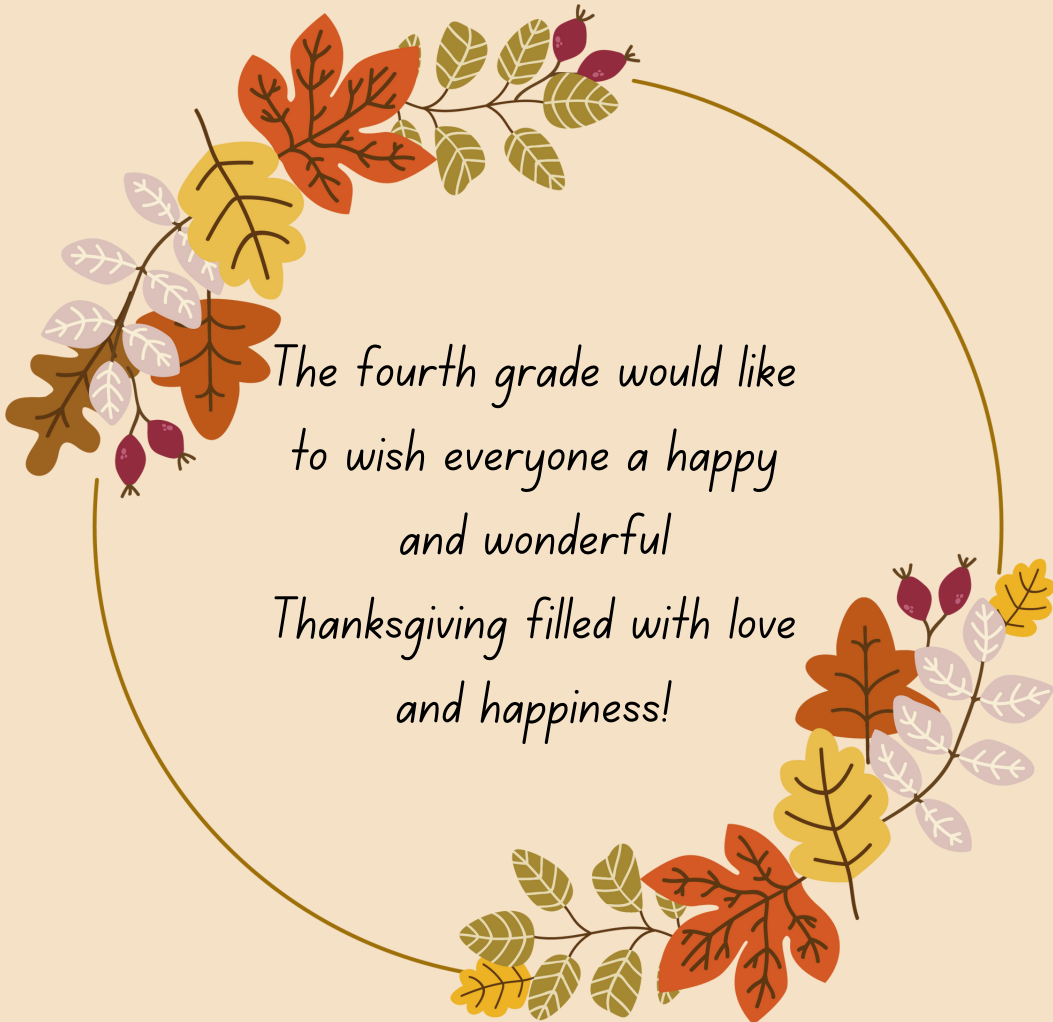
As geographers in social studies, we are coming to a close on learning about the state of New York and its physical features like landforms and waterways and will be starting to learn about the Eastern Woodland Native Americans of New York and the ways in which they used the environment around them.



As mathematicians, we are venturing into the world of multiplication. We have been reviewing how to find factors and multiples of numbers to help us get ready to learn how to multiply multi-digit numbers by one digit numbers using different strategies.



As systems engineers in science, we are nearing the end of our Energy Conversions unit are very close to finding a solution for Ergstown's electrical system to help put an end to the city's blackout problem. We then will be beginning a new unit called Vision and Light.

News from Fifth Grade




ELA

Students finished learning about the different elements of narrative stories. They read plays, poems and fantasy stories. They even wrote their own narrative story. Students will now move in to Module 3 in which they will be learning about Natural Disasters.




Math

Students are learning how to multiply multi-digit numbers. They have been working on multiplying 3 digit by 2 digit numbers as well as finding the volume of rectangular prisms.



Science

Students completed the first science unit of Patterns of Earth and Sky. They are now beginning to learn about Matter in the next topic called Modeling Matter. They will be experimenting with different substances to help answer the unit question of "what happens when two substances are mixed together?"
