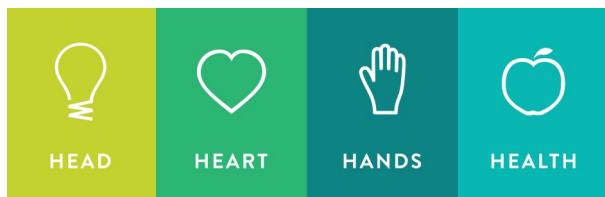




About 4-H
