


MISSION STATEMENT



Third Grade News

Third graders have just finished the first THREE modules for HMH! Moving into December, third graders will begin module 5: Teamwork. This module focuses on realistic fiction to provide students with opportunities to identify literary elements, author's craft, and theme in order to better understand unfamiliar texts. Students will also encounter narrative nonfiction and video to build knowledge across genres.

hird grade mathematicians are now becoming more skilled at multiplication AND division! Moving into December, third graders will master multiplying by multiples of ten, and begin to use strategies and properties to add and subtract.

In Social Studies, third graders are moving on to study Nigeria. Students will begin a case study on Nigeria. Students will focus on culture and the lives pepole in Nigeria live in comparison to their own.

In Science, third graders are beginning a new unit:: Inheritance and Traits.

FOURTH GRADE DECEMBER NEWSLETTER

In reading and writing we are currently working in HMH Module 4 called Heroic Feats.

In reading, we are learning what makes someone a hero by listening to, reading, and viewing a variety of texts with a focus on fairy tales and myths. In writing, we are focusing on writing a narrative story about someone we know who made a difference.



In social studies, we are continuing our work on learning about the Eastern Woodland Native Americans of New York and how they use their environment to survive.

The fourth grade also began a Flamenco Residency program with the Flamenco Vivo Carlota Santana company. For seven weeks, teachers from the company will come to school to teach the fourth grade classes the art of Flamenco dancing.

READING/WRITING

As readers, we have wrapped up Module 3: Natural Disasters where we learned about various types of natural disasters that occur and how these natural disasters can impact us. We are now moving in to Module 4: Wild West.

As writers we completed our persuasive essay where we had to take a stand on whether we would rebuild after a natural disaster occurred or move away. Our next writing piece will focus on writing a letter to a historical society requesting information about what it was like to travel west back then.

MATH


