

# **VOTER INFORMATION**

## **Qualifications of Voters**

In order to vote, you must:

- Be a United States citizen
- Be 18 years of age or older
- Be a district resident for at least 30 days prior to the vote date
- Eligible voters include those who have voted in federal, state, county, or school district elections within the past four years, those who have registered with the Nassau County Board of Elections, and residents who registered during the school district's registration period.
- Must register no later than May 14, 2024 in order to be eligible to vote at the Annual District Election.

## **Voter Registration**

The District has dedicated April 18, 2024 from 9:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m. and May 14, 2024, from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. and 6 p.m.-9 p.m. as the District Registration Days (must bring proof of residency). Registration takes place in the Conference Center located at 99 Radcliffe Road, Island Park, NY (Transportation Entrance - side of building).

## **Absentee Ballot Applications**

Application for absentee ballots may be made at the Office of the District Clerk. Applications for absentee ballots must be received by the District Clerk no earlier than thirty (30) days before the election. Furthermore, such application must be received by the District Clerk at least seven days before the election (May 14, 2024) if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the election (May 20, 2024) if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter or his/her designated agent. Upon receiving a timely request for a mailed absentee ballot, the District Clerk will mail the ballot to the address set forth in the application by no later than six (6) days before the vote. All absentee ballots must be received by the District Clerk by 5:00 p.m. on the day of the vote, May 21, 2024. If you have any questions, please contact the District Clerk at 516-434-2610. Persons designated by the Nassau County Board of Elections as permanently disabled pursuant to provisions of the Election Law will automatically receive an absentee ballot and need not apply.

## **Early Mail Voting Applications**

Application for early mail voting ballots may be made at the Office of the District Clerk. Applications for early mail voting ballots must be received by the District Clerk no earlier than thirty (30) days before the election. Furthermore, such application must be received by the District Clerk at least seven days before the election (May 14, 2024) if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the election (May 20, 2024) if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter or his/her designated agent. Upon receiving a timely request for an early mail voting ballot, the District Clerk will mail the ballot to the address set forth in the application by no later than six (6) days before the vote. All early mail voting ballots must be received by the District Clerk by 5:00 p.m. on the day of the vote, May 21, 2024. If you have any questions, please contact the District Clerk at 516-434-2610.

## **Military Ballots**

Military voters who are not currently registered may apply to register as a qualified voter of the school district. Military voters who are qualified voters of the school district may submit an application for a military ballot. Military voters may designate a preference to receive a military voter registration, military ballot application or military ballot by mail, facsimile transmission, or electronic mail in their request for such registration, ballot application or ballot. Military voter registration forms and military ballot application forms must be received in the office of the district clerk of the school district no later than 5:00 p.m. on April 25, 2024. No military ballot will be canvassed unless it is (1) received in the Office of the District Clerk before the close of the polls on election day and showing a cancellation mark of the United States postal service or a foreign country's postal service, or showing a dated endorsement of receipt by another agency of the United States government; or (2) received by the Office of the District Clerk by no later than 5:00 p.m. on election day and signed and dated by the military voter and one witness thereto, with a date which is associated to be not later than the day before the election.
