

The NYPD With Arms Wide Open Detective Steven McDonald Memorial Scholarship 2022 SCHOLARSHIP MISSION STATEMENT AND REQUIREMENTS

The mission of NYPD With Arms Wide Open is to provide a forum where police officers of all ranks, and their families, can attend meetings and discuss issues surrounding being the parents/guardians/caretakers of a child with special needs. Often times, families with special needs children feel isolated and are in need of an organization that addresses their very specific needs and issues. NYPD With Arms Wide Open helps these families care for their children while navigating through the culture, complexities and dangers of being a member of the New York City Police Department.

As an officer with the NYPD, Steven McDonald was questioning three young men in Central Park one summer day in 1986 when one of them shot him three times – leaving him paralyzed from the neck down, and dependent on a breathing apparatus. After a long recovery and rehabilitation, Detective McDonald spoke to thousands of students in schools up and down the East Coast. Aside from recounting the harrow- ing events of the day that changed his life, McDonald focused on his remarkable journey and the power of perseverance and forgiveness.

In the spirit of all that Detective Steven McDonald stood for, NYPD With Arms Wide Open has stablished a scholarship award for students within the NYPD community living with special needs or those who are the family members of an individual with special needs.

Applicant must have a family member within the NYPD - active or retired: (parent, grandparent, sibling, aunt, uncle or cousin) and be a graduating high school senior, with good academic and disciplinary standing who meet one or all of the following criteria:

- 1.) Is a student of the special needs community*
- 2.) Is the sibling of an individual with special needs*
- 3.) Has dedicated his or her community service to the special needs community
- * Special needs must be a documented physical, medical, developmental or learning disability.

- 1. Your personal essay with each page *marked with your date of birth only*. Please remove your name and any other identifying information. This ensures a completely transparent voting process for the scholarship committee.
- 2. A brief personal bio (one page) and high resolution (.JPG) headshot or Senior Portrait
- 3. A copy of your college or vocational school acceptance letter(s), or a list of the top 3-5 schools you have applied to.

Only electronic entries sent to jennifer_oreilly@live.com in PDF format will be acknowledged by the scholarship committee. Submissions will be accepted up to and including Friday, February 4, 2022. E-mail confirmation will be sent once completed entry is received. PERSONAL ESSAY FORM

Essay should be at least two to three pages type-written and double-spaced. We ask that you include a proper introduction about your personal and life experience and how it relates to the mission statement of **NYPD With Arms Wide Open** (visit www.nypdwawo.org for more information) *PLEASE DO NOT SUBMIT YOUR GENERAL COLLEGE ENTRANCE ESSAY. SUBMISSIONS WITH GENERAL ESSAYS WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED FOR SCHOLARSHIP AWARD.* Next, incorporate any **two** of the following questions in your personal essay and be sure to include your detailed response to the closing statement:

- Do you think that having special needs, or being a family member of an individual with special needs has shaped the way you look at life? How?
- Do you think everyone, regardless of disability has the ability to lead by example? Explain.
- What would a peer in a group you lead and/or perform service with say about you and your service to special needs individuals?
- What major obstacles have you overcome as an individual with special needs? How has this shaped the student, leader and young adult you have become?

CLOSING STATEMENT - How has the life story of Detective Steven McDonald inspired you as an individual with special needs, or the family member or friend of an individual with special needs? What message, like Detective McDonald's message of peace and forgiveness, would you speak about to others if given the platform?
