

# What are the updates to admissions?

### **Screened Programs**

- Superintendents engaged with their school communities around academic screens.
- The following schools have been approved to add **ONE** 6<sup>th</sup> grade Central screened program class:
  - 25Q025 I.S. 025 Adrien Block, 34-65 192 STREET FLUSHING, NY 11358
  - 25Q164 P.S. 164 Queens Valley, 138-01 77 AVENUE FLUSHING, NY 11367
  - 25Q189 J.H.S. 189 Daniel Carter Beard, 144-80 BARCLAY AVENUE FLUSHING, NY
- Each of these three schools only added one class, so seats are limited. Any District 25 family who has a child that attends a district 25 elementary school, can choose to add any of these screened programs to their application alongside the other District 25 middle school options.
- Students will be selected for these screened programs using their final fourth-grade core course grades (ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies) only. There is no other criteria for screened programs. If a student applies to a screened program and doesn't match to a seat there, they will be considered for the other programs listed on their application. Families with questions about screened programs should call the Middle School directly.
- Middle school programs admitting students through the audition, talent test, language: criteria, or screened admissions methods will **not** have a sibling priority, as those programs have distinct criteria for admission.

  - Student ID (OSIS)
  - Account Creation Code

#### Welcome!

This year, your child will apply to middle school, and this letter will help you get started. Our team is here to support you and your child's current school with middle school admissions.

Your child can apply to up to 12 middle school programs with one personalized application. Throughout this process, you will use one website, **MySchools.nyc**. Please note that MySchools and your NYC Schools Account (NYCSA) are separate websites; you will use separate accounts to log in to each one:

- You'll use MySchools (MySchools.nyc) this year to explore middle school options, submit your child's
  application, receive your middle school offer, and get waitlist information.
- You'll use NYCSA (MyStudent.nyc) during each school year to see your child's grades, attendance, fitness results, and schedule, as well as get emergency alerts and school-specific updates.

#### Right now, you can...

- Sign up for our middle school admissions email list at schools.nyc.gov/SignUp. We'll send you
  admissions tips and updates, including when the middle school application period will open and close.
- 2. Set up your MySchools account at MySchools.nyc. Here's how:
- Click or tap "Get Started." Follow the on-screen instruction. Then check your email for a message from MySchools. In that email, click the link to access your MySchools account. Once you've created a password, write it here for your reference: My password is \_\_\_\_\_\_\_.
- Click "Add a child" to connect your child to your account. On the next screen, enter your child's 9-digit student ID number (OSIS). You can find this ID number on their report card or request it from their current school.
- Enter your child's unique MySchools Account Creation Code, shown below. (Not the same as your NYCSA code)

# MySchools - Parent Login

- Parents/guardians will need to create a MySchools account using their personal email addresses
- This is different than their NYCSA account which is used to see their child's grades, attendance and schedule.
- Families can use one MySchools account for all of their children, over multiple admissions cycles.
   This means if a family applied last year they can use the same account.



Let's get started by setting up your MySchools account. It won't take long.

- After creating their MySchools account, parents/guardians may then add students to their account by entering their child's:
  - Student ID Number (OSIS)
  - Account Creation Code
- Please note, students can only be added to one parent/guardian MySchools account at a time.



# MySchools – Parent Login

- After a family adds a student, they will see their child's biographical information.
  - Student information comes from DOE systems (ATS, SESIS)
  - Academic information will not be available in MySchools.
- Families who need to update their home address will need to contact their elementary school.
- Once the address is updated in ATS, it will appear in MySchools the next day.\*\*\* To cha


# Where Can Students Apply?

Students are eligible to apply to middle school in the district where they are zoned for middle school and, when different, the district where they attend elementary school. Zoned students have a priority to attend their zoned school. Access your zoned middle school at Schoolsearch.schools.nyc or call 311.

- When families apply to middle school, they are really applying to programs at those schools.
- Some schools have more than one program, such as a Boroughwide Dual Language program and a zoned program. Types of programs include:
  - Zoned Programs: Open to students who live in the geographic zone.
  - District Programs: Open to students who are zoned to or attend elementary school in that district.
  - Boroughwide Programs: Open to students who are zoned to or attend elementary school in that borough.
  - Citywide Programs: Open to all New York City residents.



### How do we apply to NYC middle schools?



- List up to 12 programs on your application in your order of preference with your favorite program as #1
- Some schools may have multiple programs, such as a zone program and a Dual Language program. If a school has multiple programs, you may apply to more than one.
- Submit your application in MySchools by Thursday,
   December 1. After submitting you may still log back in and make changes up until the deadline.





# How should I complete my application?

- You should list up to twelve program choices in your **genuine**, **true order of preference**. Listing a program first on your application, **does not** guarantee that the student will receive an offer to that program. If you don't receive an offer to your first choice, you have the same chance of matching to your second choice as if it had been placed first, and so on.
- Don't ONLY apply to high-demand schools. If you are applying to high-demand middle schools, you should consider also applying to schools with average or lower demand.
- If a student does not receive an offer to a program on their application, they will receive an offer to a program with seat availability in their zoned district.
- After applying to your favorite choices, consider adding some additional programs. Adding programs to your application after your favorites does not lower your chance of matching to a top choice.

# MySchools: Apply to Programs





### **MySchools: Application Submission**

- Before submitting, families will have the opportunity to review their application choices.
- They must also, answer an accessibility question and certify that they are the legal parent/guardian of the applicant.
- After submitting, they will have the opportunity to update their application up until the application deadline.

### How do students get middle school offers for Fall 2023?

Seat Availability: Each middle school program has a set number of seats.

- There are specific seats for general education students, and students with disabilities. Applications are automatically assigned to one group of seats based on the student's instructional program.
- The number of applicants and available seats from last year's process is in MySchools.
- If you are interested in applying to high-demand programs, you absolutely should! But, remember to add some additional programs that have an average level of demand.



## **Admissions Priorities**

At some schools, students are considered in groups. All students in the first priority group will be considered first. If seats are available, students in the second priority group will be considered next, and so on.



TIP | You still have priority to a school even if it's not ranked first. This means you should rank programs you prefer to your zoned or continuing K-8 school ahead of your zoned or continuing K-8 school.

# Priority for Siblings

Applicants have a priority to attend the same school as their sibling

- · At schools where the final year is eighth grade,
  - Middle school applicants with siblings currently in sixth or seventh grade have priority to attend their sibling's school.
  - If the school has younger grades (for example, grades K-8), middle school applicants with siblings currently in kindergarten, first, second, third, fourth, or fifth, sixth, or seventh grade have priority to attend their sibling's school.
- At schools that continue through twelfth grade, middle school applicants with siblings currently in sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth, or eleventh grade have priority to attend their sibling's school.
- This priority includes any full-siblings, half-siblings, step-siblings or foster siblings who live in the same household
  as the middle school applicant.
- When submitting your application, you will be prompted to identify any sixth-grade siblings.

**REMINDER**: Middle school programs admitting students through the audition, language: criteria, or screened admissions methods do **not** have a sibling priority, as those programs have distinct criteria for admission.

# **Priority for Multiples**

- If you have more than one child the same age applying to middle school (ie., twins or triplets), you may choose to submit identical applications for each child, so they receive an offer to the same program.
- If you have multiple middle school applicants on your MySchools account, when submitting one application, you will be invited to automatically copy these choices to the other application(s).
- You don't need to make a school your first choice to keep your priority there.

**REMINDER** | If a family includes an audition, language: criteria, or screened program on their children's identical applications, and only one child is accepted to that program, then the children may receive separate offers.

### **Admissions Methods**

An admissions method is the way a program considers applicants for available seats. These admissions methods do not see any academic information.

- Zoned
  - Based on address
- Open
  - Random Selection

This admissions method does see academic information.

### Screened

 School ranks students based on composite of their course grades from fourth-grade. Some schools may require an assessment. All admission methods will be available in MySchools when the application opens on October 26.

### Other admissions methods

Some middle school programs admit students using other admissions methods. These include:

- Language: Criteria. Dual language programs and international programs will select applicants using language data, such as home language and English language learning status.
- Audition. Arts programs may audition applicants virtually. Applicants will record or photograph their audition and upload the files into MySchools before the deadline of Friday, December 9.


# How to Apply to **Mark Twain IS 239**Citywide school located in Coney Island, Brooklyn | Offers 11 talent-area programs.

- To apply for arts programs, like Dance, students complete an audition. Offers to these programs are made based on students' auditions.
- To apply for non-arts programs, like Science, an assessment is required. Offers to these programs are made based on the program's evaluation methods.
- Applicants can apply to one or two talent-area programs: this could be two audition programs, two
  random selection programs, or one of each.

### **Audition Programs Virtual Submission**

1. Select the audition program from the "Select Type" dropdown.

2. Upload the virtual audition by either dropping in the audition file or using the "browse files" option



Tip: Video submissions may not appear until 5-10 minutes after submission.



# How are Offers Determined?

### **The Matching Process**

- The matching process considers the applicant for the first-listed program:
- If there are fewer applicants than available seats, the applicant will get an offer to this program.
- If there are more applicants than available seats, the applicant will be considered based on their random number or ranking.
- If their random number or ranking is strong enough to get an offer the applicant will receive an offer to this program. (i.e., one of the strongest 100 numbers for a program with 100 seats)
- If not, the matching process will consider the next listed program.
- This process will continue until the student receives an offer or there are no more programs left to consider on their application.

### Offer Release and Waitlists

- Offers will be available in April. You'll get an email notification when offers are available.
- When offers are released, the waitlist process will begin.
  - You will automatically be waitlisted at any programs ranked higher than the program to which you got an offer.
  - For example, if you got an offer to your second choice program, you will be waitlisted at your first choice program.
  - You will be able to add yourselves to waitlists in MySchools.
  - More information about waitlists, including adding and removing yourself from waitlists, will be shared at that time.

# Individualized Education Plans

Students with an IEP apply to middle school the same way as students without an IEP.

Middle schools are required to provide students with any services that are listed in their IEP.
