# MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

This week, we hosted a workshop with the Board of Education. We unpacked our progress toward the first two pillars of our strategic plan. District and building leaders shared information about our social-emotional learning program, Response-to-Intervention structures, and college preparation efforts. Our partners at JumpStart also spoke about their work to help Tuckahoe students prepare for college admissions exams. The ensuing discussion was thoughtful, with students planted firmly at the center of our work.

Our UPK Leadership Team welcomed families virtually in an open house information session. They covered the different considerations families bring to the Pre-K selection process, the curriculum we implement, and the connections to the K-12 program. Ms. Faith Sparks covered the details of the lottery and application program. More information can be found below!

This week we shared information about an upcoming capital project. The exciting details will be shared at our next Board of Education meeting, which can be streamed on our website. My letter to the community is included in this edition of the Happenings. Additionally, our staff worked on the extended day on important initiatives like vocabulary integration, differentiation, and data inquiry.

# **Proposed Capital Project**

Dear Tuckahoe Schools Community:

On Monday, December 12th, the Trustees of the Board of Education will be discussing a proposal from our Facilities Committee to launch a new Capital Project to redesign the Cottle cafeteria and improve our HVAC systems. These and other infrastructure improvements were a part of recommendations put forth in our recent building condition survey.

Due to unprecedented inflation and supply chain issues, the bids for the HVAC work and the addition and alterations to the Cottle cafeteria were not able to be completed as part of the previous project. Despite this setback to our original scope, several key components of the 2021 project are either complete or nearing completion. These include:

- New William E. Cottle Field, a broad, turf-based playing space for recess, athletics, and community use;
- William E. Cottle Playground and Siwanoy Boulevard Improvements, providing additional playing space in a safe, engaging enclosure for our Cottle Cubs and community;
- **Redesign of the MS/HS Library**, with open learning spaces, breakout rooms for student collaboration, and state-of-the-art AV equipment and learning furniture; and
- **Renovation of the MS/HS Cafeteria**, including new eating spaces, display boards, and modern furniture and design.

We are proud of what we were able to accomplish. Building on this momentum, we worked with community and Board members on our Facilities Committee to develop a proposal we will present at the next meeting of the Board of Education. This proposal will be put before voters in February of 2023:

William E. Cottle School:

• Additional funding to complete the work that could not be completed as part of the previous project. This includes upgrades and improvements to our cafeteria at William E. Cottle Elementary School and HVAC work. This HVAC work will provide upgrades to ventilation and air quality for student/staff health and wellness.

• New funding for critical infrastructure work that has surfaced in the past few years, including security upgrades such as new cameras and doors.

The additional funding for the Cottle scope listed above is approximately \$3,450,000. The proposed improvements at the William E. Cottle cafeteria have been re-designed to lower the proposed cost of this project element. The Facilities Committee, including building administrators, supports this redesign and agree that it will meet the school's needs.

Tuckahoe Middle/High School:

- Additional funding to complete the work that could not be completed as part of the previous project. This includes HVAC work in the older part of the building and some masonry restoration work. The HVAC work will provide upgrades to ventilation and air quality for student/staff health and wellness.
- Partial roof replacement and related masonry repair,
- Replacement of all steam piping and traps in the pipe tunnels,
- Additional masonry restoration,
- Replacement of all steam traps above the pipe tunnels,
- Repair leaking plumbing piping, and
- Security upgrades, including replacing the entire PA/intercom/bell & clock system.

The new funding for Tuckahoe Middle/High School totals \$5,800,000. This component of the project addresses major infrastructure needs and will preserve the longevity of our assets and facilities. These investments aim to maintain a state of good repair in our buildings and modernize our assets. The District does ongoing, routine maintenance work every year. The proposed work is not considered "routine maintenance," but, instead, it is composed of projects that fall outside the definition of routine maintenance. Replacing these big-ticket items that are approaching or are at the end of their useful lives through the bond will avoid costly, emergency action in the future, achieve economies of scale and minimize disruption to the students. Investment in school facilities is effective not only in achieving its primary goal of improving health and safety but also in inducing secondary effects such as heightened academic performance. A quality educational environment can have a positive influence on the attitudes and behaviors of both students and teachers.

The replacement of interior lighting will be included at both schools to the extent that the budget will allow.

Our historic buildings require updates, and our learning spaces need to be redesigned to keep pace with the progress we make toward our strategic plan goals. The total proposed funding request is for \$9,250,000. \$750,000 of that amount will be requested to be taken from the capital reserve fund established by the Board for this purpose.

## **Chess Champs at Cottle!**




Cottle was represented by Fourth Graders William Owen and Riyaan Walambe at the National Scholastic Chess Foundation Tournament (NSCF) hosted by the Bronxville Schools on Saturday, December 3rd. William and Riyaan both competed in the Booster Section, which is a US Chess Federation-rated section. Approximately 30 players competed in the section. William scored 3.5 points (3W 1D 0L) and finished in second place to the only other competitor in the section to score 3.5 points based on tiebreak rules. Riyaan scored an impressive 2.5 points (2W 1D 1L).


In addition to individual trophies, NSCF also awards team trophies to the top 3 schools in each section. The scores for the top four players from each school are aggregated to determine team standings. Despite having only two players, William and Riyaan's combined score of six points won the second-place team trophy for Cottle. They outscored many schools with three or

four players!

## **Bringing Story Elements to Life**



In Ms. Conway's eighth-grade English Language Arts, students practiced the craft of writing by practicing a variety of techniques to zoom into a small moment. Students created focused narratives where they used sensory detail, figurative language, and strong word choice. Afterward, they created visual representations of their writing to publish their best lines and the writing techniques they employed. Students are learning to make complex inferences and use contextual evidence, such as imagery of figurative language, to support their writing.

#### TUCKAHOE UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT ANNOUNCES KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Registration for Kindergarten students for the 2023-2024 school year will be held on **Wednesday, January 25, 2023** and **Thursday, January 26, 2024**. Children who will be five years of age by December 1, 2023 are eligible to attend Kindergarten.

Parents/Legal Guardians are urged to register children according to the following schedule, utilizing the first letter of the child's last name:

Wednesday, January 25, 2023	9:00AM – 11:00AM	A – L
Thursday, January 26, 2023	9:00AM – 11:00AM	M – Z

Registration takes place at the William E. Cottle Elementary School, 2 Siwanoy Boulevard, Eastchester, New York in the Auditorium. At the time of registration, parents/legal guardians must bring the required registration forms, which can be found on the District's website (<u>www.tuckahoeschools.org</u>), filled out and notarized along with the following documents:

#### Three (3) Proofs of Residence

Parents/Legal Guardians must bring originals and copies of the following documents:

1. Property tax bill, deed, co-op shares, <u>Or</u> a signed current lease (valid through June 2024)

#### <u>AND</u>

2. Con Edison bill, cable bill, phone bill, <u>Or</u> current income tax return

#### <u>AND</u>

3. NYS Driver's License, NYS Registration <u>Or</u> NYS Insurance Card with your current address

#### <u>AND</u>

- Your Child's Proof of Age (i.e., birth certificate, passport, baptismal certificate, etc.)
- Your Child's Immunization Record including date of last physical exam
- If you are divorced or separated, please bring a copy of your Custody Agreement.


