#### All Three Elementary Schools:

- Among all three elementary schools, there will be class sizes that increase and decrease next year.
- Although there will be grade levels in which an additional teacher is needed next year for an additional class, there will also be grade levels where the number of classes are reduced, thus allowing staff to move among grade levels.
- At this time, we do not see a need to increase the number of classroom teacher FTEs.
- We will monitor grade level and class size throughout the spring and summer.

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#### **Elementary Budget Priorities:**

1. ENL (English as a New Language) Instruction:

Add .5 FTE ENL Instructor to meet minimum mandated minutes required by NYS. This need has resulted from the steady increase in the number of students enrolled in the CCSD requiring English as a New Language instruction.

#### 2. <u>KPS RTI (Response to Intervention)/ENL Instruction</u>:

Add 1.0 FTE ENL Instructor to provide RTI Instruction for those students requiring English as a New Language instruction. All three elementary schools will then have an equal number of RTI Teachers. An ENL certified RTI teacher will provide an opportunity to design instruction meeting the needs of our students requiring English as a New Language instruction.



#### Increase literacy support for elementary students

• Possible action: Increase TA support in Kindergarten and 1st grade for small group phonics instruction • Possible action: Increase Special Education Teacher contact time with students across grades K-2 • Anticipated outcome: This will lead to decreased intervention and special education services in the intermediate grades

Increase STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts, and Mathematics) experiences for elementary students

- Possible action: Increase time with Library Media Specialist at the elementary levels (rotation 2 days in a 6 day cycle)
- Possible action: Increase student access and exposure to young adult literature and the new technology standards
- Possible action: Continue to increase professional development opportunities for teachers in the areas of STEAM
- Anticipated outcome: Students will gain early skills in coding, math and science that will allow for successful entry into secondary programs such as PLTW
