PROPOSITION # 1: KLSD BUDGET

The first proposition on the ballot is the Katonah-Lewisboro School District's operating budget for the 2022-23 school year. The proposed budget supports and strengthens the outstanding academic program offered within the Katonah-Lewisboro School District while being fiscally responsible. The budget is below the New York State tax levy cap.

PROPOSITION # 2: BUS REPLACEMENT & ELECTRIC VEHICLES

In addition to the general fund budget proposal, you will have an opportunity to weigh in on a proposition to transfer funds from the 2021-22 general fund to the capital fund to replace district vehicles. If approved, there would be no impact to taxes and no additional debt would be incurred. The replacement of buses and vans on a rotational basis is important to maintaining safe, dependable transportation for our students. This year, the proposition includes the purchase of our first electric vehicles – a 66-passenger bus and a four-wheel-drive SUV for the transportation department – an important step in our sustainability efforts. In total, all the vehicles in this proposition would be purchased at a cost not to exceed \$921,975.

VOTER INFORMATION

All voters registered with Westchester County are automatically registered to vote in their school district's budget and school board election. If you are not registered to vote, you may register at any of the schools in the district or at the District Office between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. on regular school/business days, as well as at the District Office on Saturday, May 7, 2022 between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. Registration is open through Thursday, May 12, 2022.

Voter Qualifications

An individual must:

- Be a U.S. citizen, 18 years of age or older.
- Have been a resident of the school district for at least 30 days preceding the day of the vote.

Absentee Ballots

Absentee ballots are permitted in all school board elections and/or referenda. Absentee ballots may be cast by a qualified voter who is:

- A patient in a hospital or who is unable to vote because of illness or physical disability.
- Out of the county of residence on election day because of business, vacation or other duty.

If you prefer to vote without coming to school due to COVID, you must request an application for an absentee ballot. When completing the application, you must check the box "temporary illness or physical disability" to receive an absentee ballot.

Requesting Absentee Ballots

Any person seeking an absentee ballot must complete an application obtained from District Clerk Kimberly Monzon or downloaded from the district's website, klschools.org, and return it to the District Clerk by mail or in person.

If the application is returned by mail, it must be received by the District Clerk by Tuesday, May 10, 2022. If the application is delivered personally, it must be received by the District Clerk no later than 5 p.m. on Monday, May 16, 2022. The District Office is located at 60 North Salem Road, Cross River, NY 10518.

Once the District Clerk receives the application, an absentee ballot will be mailed to the address specified on the application. Absentee ballots must be received by the District Clerk no later than 5 p.m. on Tuesday, May 17, 2022. It is possible to deliver the completed application, complete the actual ballot and turn it in on the same day.
