


WEC Artists Celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month

The Grade 5 students learned about the life and work of Jean-Michel Basquiat, a Puerto Rican and Haitian graffiti artist. They viewed and discussed the symbolism and messages in his art, focusing on equality and human rights. The biographical story *Radiant Child* by Javaka Steptoe was read as an introduction to his childhood and path to artistic celebrity.

The classes learned how to draw in a graffiti style and chose a "tag" to create for themselves. Students were encouraged to express their identities using symbols, fonts, and color choices to represent something about themselves. Their final step was adding a brick-walled background.



Facilities Update

The District continues to navigate a turbulent economic climate, but we maintain steadfast in our commitment to improving the experience for our Tuckahoe learners. Due to the current economic landscape and supply chain issues, we will not be able to complete the full scope of this bond project, but much is getting done in this round. In the coming weeks, we will begin to assess ways to complete the remaining scope of this project and prioritize emerging infrastructure needs.

What we are able to complete:

- Cottle: Turf field, including improvements to Siwanoy Blvd.
- MS/HS: Library renovation
- MS/HS: Cafeteria renovation
- MS/HS New Wing: HVAC units retrofitted and or replaced to provide air conditioning and a higher level of filtration (MERV 13)
- MS/HS: Hardware/Security Upgrades to the exterior and interior doors.
- MS/HS: Upgrade Emergency Lighting and Fire Alarm System.
- MS/HS: Replace exterior stairs and railings at the Gymnasium exit.

What we are unable to complete at the present time:

- Cottle: Cafeteria renovation and expansion
- Cottle: Renovation of certain bathrooms
- Cottle: Replace Corridor Ceilings and related abatement
- Cottle: Update balance of fire alarm system
- Cottle: Mechanical Ventilation in older classrooms
- MS/HS: Mechanical Ventilation in older classrooms


