





Cottle Turf Field

We are all committed to providing high-quality and safe playing surfaces for our multi-use athletic facilities and playgrounds, but we need the help and consideration of the community and all user groups in protecting the community's investment.

The Cottle turf field is prohibited from public use while school is in session or during school-related events. Field is open from Dawn to Dusk.



TURF FIELD RULES

- NO BICYCLES, SKATEBOARDS OR ROLLERBLADES PERMITTED ON TRACK OR TURF FIELD.
- NO PETS PERMITTED.
- NO METAL CLEATS, HIGH-HEELED SHOES OR BARE FEET.
- NO DRIVING STAKES.
- NO USE OF ANY GAS-POWERED VEHICLES, BIKES, OR ATV'S.
- NO REMOTE CONTROLLED RECREATIONAL OR HOBBY TOYS OF ANY KIND, INCLUDING DRONES.
- NO GOLFING, GOLF PRACTICE OR CHIPPING.
- NO SMOKING, VAPING, OR ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES.
- NO LOITERING.
- NO FOOD OF ANY KIND, SUNFLOWER SEEDS OR GUM.
- WATER IS THE ONLY BEVERAGE ALLOWED ON THE TURF FIELD. ALL OTHER BEVERAGES INCLUDING GATORADE AND OTHER SPORTS DRINKS ARE PROHIBITED. ALL DRINKS MUST BE IN NON-BREAKABLE BOTTLES ONLY.
- NO CANDLES OR OPEN FLAMES.
- APPROVED ATHLETIC EQUIPMENT ONLY.
- NO ENGAGING IN COMMERCIAL ACTIVITY, VENDING, OR ORGANIZED SPORTS EXCEPT BY PERMIT.
- ADULT SUPERVISION REQUIRED. PLAY AT YOUR OWN RISK.

- NO PETS IN PLAY AREAS.
- COURT IS FOR BASKETBALL ONLY.
- NO FOOD OF ANY KIND OR GLASS CONTAINERS IN THE PLAY AREA.
- ADULT SUPERVISION REQUIRED FOR USE. PLAY AT YOUR OWN RISK.

Transportation Reminders!

As a reminder to families, please see the bus stop safety information below and share it with your children:

Before the Bus Arrives

Your child should arrive at the bus stop at least five minutes before the bus is scheduled to arrive. When the bus approaches, stand at least three giant steps (6 feet) away from the curb, and line up away from the street. Remind your child that the bus stop is not a place to run or play. Please stay off of private property when waiting for the bus and wait at the designated official bus stop.



Getting On and Off Safely

When the school bus arrives, your child should wait until the bus comes to a complete stop, the door opens, and the driver says it's okay to get on or off. Your child should use the handrails to avoid falling.

Always Use Caution Around the Bus

Your child should never walk behind a school bus. If your child must cross the street in front of the bus, tell them to walk on a sidewalk or along the side of the street to a place at least five giant steps (10 feet) in front of the bus before crossing. Your child should also make eye contact with the bus driver before crossing to make sure the driver can see that they're crossing to avoid the danger zone. If your child drops something near the school bus, like a phone or book, the safest thing is for your child to tell the bus driver right away. Your child should not try to pick up the item, because the driver might not be able to see them.



TUCKAHOE UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT ANNOUNCES KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Registration for Kindergarten students for the 2023-2024 school year will be held on **Wednesday, January 25, 2023** and **Thursday, January 26, 2024**. Children who will be five years of age by December 1, 2023 are eligible to attend Kindergarten.

Parents/Legal Guardians are urged to register children according to the following schedule, utilizing the first letter of the child's last name:

Wednesday, January 25, 2023 9:00AM – 11:00AM A – L

Thursday, January 26, 2023 9:00AM – 11:00AM M – Z

Registration takes place at the William E. Cottle Elementary School, 2 Siwanoy Boulevard, Eastchester, New York in the Auditorium. At the time of registration, parents/legal guardians must bring the required registration forms, which can be found on the District's website (www.tuckahoeschools.org), filled out and notarized along with the following documents:

Three (3) Proofs of Residence

Parents/Legal Guardians must bring originals and copies of the following documents:

1. Property tax bill, deed, co-op shares, <u>Or</u> a signed current lease (valid through June 2024)

AND

2. Con Edison bill, cable bill, phone bill, Or current income tax return

AND

3. NYS Driver's License, NYS Registration <u>Or</u> NYS Insurance Card with your current address

AND

- Your Child's Proof of Age

 (i.e., birth certificate, passport, baptismal certificate, etc.)
- Your Child's Immunization Record including date of last physical exam
- If you are divorced or separated, please bring a copy of your Custody Agreement.
