

- Out of the 213 fall varsity athletes, 128 had a GPA in the first quarter of 90% or above. (60%)
- Varsity boys' volleyball and varsity girls swim (Merged Team) had their inaugural season.
- The Carmel Athletic Hall of Fame inducted its first class since 2013.







The Evolution of the Athletic Directors Role

Changes in recent years:

- Increase in Athletic Programs (Added Programs: Varsity and JV Boys Volleyball, Varsity Girls Swim, Varsity Boys Swim, Varsity Flag Football)
- Bus/Driver shortages-Supervisors and game workers become impacted-Game times are delayed for later start times
- Shortage of officials: Games are constantly being changed and rescheduled
- Streaming games Management of setup, changes and access.
- Social media
- Increase in community engagement and communications
- Shortage of coaches
- New coaches in varsity positions –Implementation of a professional development plan
- Increased concern for security and event management
- Student expectations Sportsmanlike Conduct, appropriate behaviors at games and athletic events
- Focus on Mental Health of Student-Athletes
