MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

As we wrap up January, we encourage everyone to check out our capital project website, where we have information about our proposed bond and a communication timeline. On February 15th, the community will be asked to come out to the polls for a vote on a bond referendum to fund this work. This project includes a renovation and modernization of the Cottle Cafeteria; much-needed infrastructure repairs in the middle/high school building so that broken and deteriorated pipes and areas of the tunnel are fixed/replaced and partial roof replacements to ensure students/teachers have well-functioning heat and will no longer be assigned to classes because of leaks. New air conditioning and ventilation will be installed in all three schools to match the new wing air exchange systems for the health and wellness of the staff and students.



Lunar New Year Celebration









In honor of the Lunar New Year (which begins this weekend), the 4th grade team (Mrs. Pappas, Mrs. Quartararo, Ms. Crotty, Mrs. Merkel, and Mrs. Hatcher) created engaging lessons in both ELA and Math centered around the holiday. In ELA, we read the story "Sam and the Lucky Money" by Karen Chinn. In addition, the students learned about the many traditions and festivals associated with Lunar New Year. In groups, they identified possible themes of the book and provided evidence to support the themes they chose.

In Math, fourth-grade classes learned about Tangram Art and created their own puzzles using a variety of geometric shapes. Our art teacher, Mrs. Depouli, also had students create beautiful lanterns. The lantern festival is a traditional festival that marks the end of the Lunar New Year (on the 15th day). At the end of the event, each child received a lai-see/lei-see/hang bao (red envelope) with ELA and Math homework passes inside! We discussed with the students that red in Chinese culture symbolizes good fortune, luck, and happiness.





A trip to the NY Philharmonic




