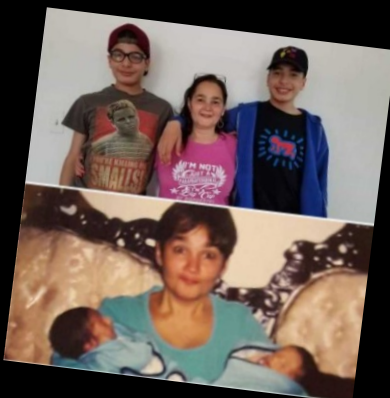
My favorite dish would be BBQ Ribs and a baked potato with a virgin pina colada.

Pipi and Hachi are the names of my two dogs.

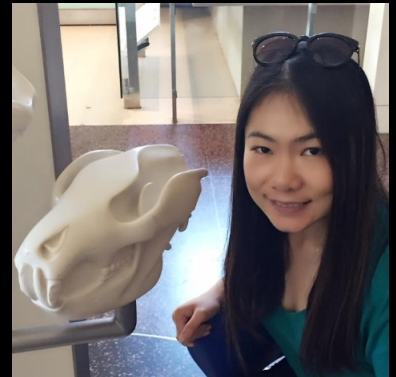
Generally, I like Korean, Indian and Chinese food.
