Math: Numbers to 10

Students will count and write numerals from 0 to 10, Pair and count set of objects, Compose/Decompose numbers 1-10 and use one-to-one correspondence

Reading: Emergent Story Books and **Shared Texts**

Read text with meaning and understanding Retell in various ways to grow an understanding of characters, setting, and events in the text

Writing: Show and Tell: From Labels to Pattern Books


Students will create their own books, talk about their writing with excitement and write lots of sentences across pages in a pattern, using highfrequency words label pictures using one or more letter sound.

Social Studies: Self and Others

Students will understand and celebrate differences and similarities between people and cultures (language, traditions, religion, traditions, customs, etc.).

Science: Needs of Plants and Animals

The unit examines the problem of the declining monarch population on a smaller scale. Students assume the role of scientists helping to explain why there are no more caterpillars in a community garden

Fun Sight Word Activities

Word Hunt: Look for sight words in books, magazines, the newspaper or anything you read. If using the newspapers/magazines your child can highlight or circle the words they find.

Concentration: Create two sets of word cards. Place the word cards face down. Have your child turn over two cards, trying to make a match. Continue until all of the words are matched.

Words You Can Eat: Write your words in whipped cream, peanut butter, carrots or anything you can eat.

Write the sight words using:

Playdough, Alphabet stamps, letters out of magazines, Magnetic letters, Salt/Rice on a tray, Shaving Cream, or in sand or dirt
