

Participation is granted on a <u>first come</u>, <u>first serve basis of registration either online or through the call center</u>. There are no exceptions! Girls will be accepted in the order that their registrations are received. If more spaces become available, girls will be taken in the order they registered from the waitlist.

# There is still time to complete the 5 Essentials Survey for Western Avenue!

District 161 will join the <u>Illinois State Board of Education</u> (ISBE) in the sixth statewide survey of school climate and learning conditions. The survey provides a unique opportunity for students, teachers and parents to have a voice in improving their schools. Students in grades four through eight, teachers and parents will be asked to take a 10-15 minute research-based survey to help identify strengths and weaknesses in their school's learning environment. We encourage parents and guardians to complete the survey to provide feedback to impact change in the district. *All District 161 parents and guardians should have received the link to the survey on December 5th. You are able to complete the survey on any device.* 

We are currently at 30% participation (131 parents in total have responded) for Western Avenue Elementary. This is one of the highest parent participation rates that Western Avenue has seen for this survey! The window closes on January 31st. Let's keep up the awesome work, parents!

#### **Student Files**

Our secretary is currently updating all student files in the Main Office so that we have all required documentation for our students on file. We sent out a robocall for two days this past week to alert parents that there may be a letter from the school requesting certain documentation. This may be a copy of your child's birth certificate, or something like a home language survey (HLS) form that we need

completed. If your child is missing something from their file, you should have received a letter in your child's backpack. All documentation should be turned into the Main Office. We want to thank you in advance for your help and support with updating our student files!

#### **Classroom Visits from Parents**

At Western Avenue Elementary, we welcome visits from our parents into classrooms! However, please remember to contact your teacher directly via email or phone at least 24 hours in advance to arrange a date and time for your visit. Especially now that testing has started, it is important that if a visit is arranged, that it is done around the testing windows. Thank you in advance for your support!

#### Traffic Flow at Arrival and Dismissal Times

Parents, we understand that everyone is rushing to get their days started in the morning. However, we need to do a better job driving safely in the drop-off and pick-up lines. We have three staff members directing traffic at the front lot, two staff members posted at door I, and multiple people posted at the playgrounds and blacktop area between the playgrounds. We also have one person directing traffic in the North parking lot. Please remember that there is a traffic flow. Students must be dropped off in the designated car lines. Please do not drop off your children on any other street or sidewalk other than the designated lines. Please do not wait in line to make sure your child walks to the door because that stops the flow for other parents behind you. And please be very mindful when you are pulling away from the car line. There should only be one priority for morning drop off and afternoon pick up—and that priority is the safety of all our kids at Western Avenue. If we all work together, we can ensure the safety of all students. Thank you!
